Palm Sunday is also Passion Sunday

Saint Paul writes, "his state was divine, yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave" (Phil 2:6-7). In the Passion, this year from Saint Matthew, Judas accepts thirty pieces of silver to betray Jesus (Mt 26:15). In Exodus (Ex 21:32) a slave, who has been gored to death by an ox, is worth thirty pieces of silver from the owner of the ox to the master of the slave. Jesus will be gored by nails, indirectly owned by the chief priests, and Judas will be paid thirty pieces. Jesus Who is the Master has become the Slave, and Judas.....the master.

Saint Paul's words, taken from the second reading today, capture something of the essence of Palm Sunday: that from the heights of the Son's eternal existence, He lovingly consents to be made as one of us, made in the flesh of a creature. As such He is rightly hailed as the long-awaited Son of David, the Davidic King prophesied in 2 Samuel 7, Who will, at last, fulfil the eternal throne of David in Person.

We begin to see why the arrival of Jesus into Jerusalem is a moment of such importance, an event of true cosmic and salvific depth: the Promised One is, at last, entering into Jerusalem, which is the 'true pole of the earth' (Ps 48), for it was there that the eternal, "I AM WHO I AM" (Ex 3:14), chose to dwell in the Temple, until the unfaithfulness of Israel led to His departure (Ezek 11:22). But still Jerusalem, and the Temple, remained the holiest place in His universe.

So when we wave palms at the beginning of the sacred Liturgy today, we are sharing the true expectation of those Jews who travelled with Jesus to Jerusalem, for here is the long-awaited Messiah, the Son of David, Who will be able to rescue them from Roman oppression and from the false Herodian monarchy which was currently reigning in Jerusalem. Although their vision is understandable, it was only part of the entire truth; Jesus' kingdom is not of this world.

Jesus has come to suffer and die for our sins. Saint Paul speaks of the eternal Son, "accepting death, death on a cross", assuming the condition of a slave. The thirty pieces of silver lends Biblical credence that Jesus has become a slave for us. When we wave our palms for the entry of the King of the universe into His holy city, Zion, "true pole of the earth", will we then live as if this is actually true? Fr Ben
