The Wisdom of Atticus

Before the start of *To Kill a Mockingbird* on Wednesday, there was shock in our little family gathering that I had neither read the book nor seen the film. This vast lacuna in my education has been partially filled and I know now what I have been missing. Indeed, since the curtain fell, with a number of recent conversations and meetings on my mind, one of Atticus's pearls of wisdom has become an earworm: "A mob is where people go to take a break from their conscience". To wit, as I write this, it is a couple of days before the coronation of King Charles and Queen Camilla. Opinion polls and talking heads known and unknown on various media say our country is entirely split between *nuovo* cavaliers and roundheads. Of course, people's response to the final question of surveys is skewed in a particular direction by the questions that lead up to it, but you could easily believe that we are about to replay the Battle of Naseby on Union Flag picnic blankets laid out with broad bean and spinach quiches. Thus, since this newsletter goes online on Fridays, I remind you royalist, republican or indifferent—that Christ exhorts us to love even our enemies and to pray for those who "persecute" us. So why not come to Mass at 7:30pm on Friday 5 May to pray for two very public figures who will pledge, as we have done, to uphold our nation's Christian principles in a world which is often hostile to our Faith? And just last week a parent lamented that their child no longer comes to Mass because "they all stop at that age", while at the previous Mass a teenager said their peers had lapsed not out of existential angst but to "follow the crowd". Moreover, we can't address people as if they all are in a "mob" like a senior Diocesan figure did when delivering a set patter to your Finance Committee with flagrant disregard for their expertise and success at turning around the balance sheet, all the while juggling hectic work and family lives. Pope Benedict XVI said, "Truth is not determined by a majority vote". He echoes Christ's words that He is the way, a way we know that is often a narrow and lonely path. So let us not join a trendy mob but first listen to our conscience, the law of God written on our hearts. May God indeed save the King, while I begin a dog-eared paperback belonging to someone with a rather familiar name in class 5C. Fr Kevin
