If Jesus Came Today...

Our Blessed Lady's fiat, her "yes", to embracing body and soul her part in the Incarnation at the message of the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation, her giving her body to form the Body of Christ, Corpus Christi, on earth in history, was not a response that sat well with the people of the time. As an unmarried young woman she risked not only the shame of her family and rejection by Joseph (albeit briefly until the fullness of the Incarnation was explained to him), but also being stoned to death for adultery by the religious authorities. In our world today she might also have faced pressure, for the sake of her education, getting a foot firmly on the career ladder first, and so on, to have a termination, an abortion. In contrast, as Catholics we would advise that the Church's teaching is that life is to be nurtured from conception to its natural end in all circumstances. With that teaching in mind, in England and Wales, Day for Life is celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year. This year (next Sunday, in fact), for the first time, it will be celebrated in Scotland and Ireland on the same day. The theme is 'Listen to Her' and focuses on post-abortion trauma and the impact of terminations primarily on women, but also on men and others. Such an emphasis echoes the reflection of St (Mother) Teresa of Calcutta who once said, "Abortion kills twice. It kills the body of the baby and it kills the conscience of the mother. Abortion is profoundly anti-women. Three quarters of its victims are women: half the babies and all the mothers." Now you may think this a little sensationalist, but the message for this year's Day for Life has been written not by a senior Church figure but

by a woman of about Mary's age who had an abortion. She wrote it in the hope that it can offer opportunities for healing and reconciliation. She wrote it in the hope that knowing the impact the abortion had on her life, others might know about and make different choices. The voices of women who have had an abortion are often silent or unheard. So please support *Day for Life* next week and help break this silence for them. And let us not forget the silent voices of those in the womb today: who knows what their message might be or what their bodies, their real presence, might contribute to our salvation. *Fr Kevin*
