May We Learn From Saint Paul

"Avoid anything in your everyday lives that would be unworthy of the gospel of Christ" (Phil 1:27). These words from Saint Paul in our reading today present to us the importance of Jesus. To be frank, even describing Jesus as important is to do Him a disservice. Jesus transcends the important: He is Life. Saint Paul writes, "life to me, of course, is Christ, [] I want to be gone and be with Christ, which would be very much better, but for me to stay alive in this body is a more urgent need for your sake" (Phil 1:21, 23-24).

Following his conversion to Jesus, Saint Paul would spend every moment of this earthly life dying to himself, so as to root the living gift of his conversion in the risen eternal Lord, Jesus Christ. When we read Saint Paul's letters, do we read them as written by a very ardent disciple of Jesus from long ago who was writing in a way which does not have much relevance for today? Or, when we read them, do we see and hear something of the glory and utterly transcendental, the heavenly Jesus Christ, Son of the Father, shining His radiance into the heart, mind and body of the Apostle? I pray that, as each of us grows in faith and discipleship, it becomes ever more the latter.

The readings from Isaiah and Saint Matthew's Gospel are crystal clear that the kingdom of heaven and the Lord's ways are so different from ours. How important this is. You see, Saint Paul's writings reflect this glory. His words bring the power and real transformative dynamism of the Lord to us.

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches that the kingdom of heaven is so wonderful that the saints who live there would never be envious of another's gifts. The saint in heaven would never begrudge his or her journey into heaven regardless of its long or arduous path. Isaiah also stresses that the Lord's thoughts and ways are so high above ours; that the Lord is rich in forgiving.

If a man or woman were to become so enamoured of the kingdom of heaven; if a man or a woman were to become so taken by the Lord's eternal ways of glory and love, they would, in some way, reflect Saint Paul's total abandonment to the risen glory of Jesus. They would seek the kingdom of heaven in every part of their daily lives. Well, Saint Paul is our brother, so how are we to live? *Fr Ben*
