Our Life in Christ

In preparing to take leave of you after four years, four years in which I have had the honour of serving as your Assistant Priest, providence has blessed us with readings this Sunday which ask us to take stock of our lives: how have we been living in response to almighty God? Both the Prophet Ezekiel and Jesus teach starkly about whether a human person is either following the Lord's will or not. There is no middle ground.

In the Gospel, Jesus encounters from the chief priests and elders of the people a reluctance to relinquish their sense of self-sufficiency and pride. They are filled with a sense of their own importance, their success, which closes them off from seeing how deep is their need to turn everything to the Lord. Jesus mentions John the Baptist as an example of one who was prepared to turn all to the Lord, and that they, the leaders, were unwilling to embrace his way and acclaim, "yes, all for the Lord". My dearest brothers and sisters in Christ, over these last four years, are we learning to cry ever more deafeningly, "yes, all for the Lord", or is it a, "well, surely that's enough, isn't it?" We can ask, and indeed we must, why is it that Christianity asks disciples of the Lord Jesus to be so radical? Why is it that Jesus asks so much of us, "if you would be perfect, go, sell what you possess and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." When the young man heard this he went away sorrowful; for he had great possessions" (Mt 19:21)?

The radicality of Christianity springs from the very eternal Son of God emptying Himself (Phil 2:7), debasing Himself, to take on our frail flesh, to enter history, to take on our sin. Saint Paul, in the reading from Philippians, describes the Son's humility in entering creation as a man and accepting death, even death on a cross (Phil 2:8). It is from this self-emptying, this earth-shattering humility (literally), that Jesus arises victorious. Jesus has permeated His entire creation and offers to man His sinless glory, love, and friendship, risen from darkness. In taking stock, let us concretely turn towards Jesus' glory? During these four years, you have helped me long to say yes to Jesus more ardently and to desire a more childlike dependence on Him. How can I ever thank you? "I will lift up the cup of salvation".
