


CATHOLIC CHURCH OF OUR LADY, ST JOHN'S WOOD

A few parishioners have asked how I should be addressed now. When Abbot Basil Hume was appointed Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster and asked the same question by Sir Robin Day he said, "I can cope with anything apart from, 'Hey you,'" I leave it with you. Ultimately the only title that matters is that of "Father" provided, as Christ instructs, such fatherhood is exercised in a spiritual way as practiced by Abraham, Joseph and Elijah in the Old Testament—a desire to bring people to a closer union with God by accompanying them on their journey through life. This too is what Christ sought to do as the ideal rabbi/master/teacher immersed in the midst of people's ordinary lives. He then instructed His apostles to continue that role of teaching all nations what He had passed on to them in a way that any ever-present father would. Hence Saints Peter, Paul and John often refer to the different church communities they are addressing as children.

Interestingly, this pedagogy or way of teaching was something we looked at in a recent catechetical class. The *General Directory on Catechesis* (*GDC*) helps us understand this by advising priests to "read the signs of the times...and speak to men as friends" (*GDC 146*) and so develop their teaching "with careful concern for... human nature" (*Dei Verbum 13*).

Since our parishes began to share their priests six weeks ago such accompaniment has been easier with Fr Ben still being here. But now that he has moved to his new parish, we need to find a way that your two priests can provide a more stable continuity of presence in both parishes. Yes, supply priests (assisted by the generosity of many laypeople who have taken on new roles in both St John's Wood and Marylebone) can provide the invaluable Sacramental personal encounter with Christ , but those priests cannot give that sense of shepherds "living with the sheep" as Pope Francis calls us to offer.

Thus, Fr Alex and I invite you to discuss with us a way forward for both parishes at 7:00pm on Friday 20 October at Our Lady of the Rosary, NW1 5QT. Then, as the Catechism puts it, we might better be "a gentle guest and friend who inspires, guides, corrects and strengthens [you] in this life", whatever you call us. Fr Kevin
