Better Late than Never

It's quite common for brides to arrive late, though the delay rather depends on the bride. I've had one situation when I insisted the bride go around the block again when she was early, and because some of the wedding party had arrived without their wedding garments (a story for another time!). I've had another where the bride was so late, I had to warn her that her marriage might soon be invalid, as it had long past the time on the marriage schedule that the supposed marriage should have taken place. Needless to say, the bride's appearance was pretty instantaneous!

One expects the bride to be late, but as the priest, I'm also witness to those guests who arrive late. They slip in at the back, crouching and tiptoeing in, praying for an empty bench, only to find the remaining seats next to the bride's mother on the front row.

As weddings are costly affairs, couples and families are understandably annoyed if people, are not only late, but never show up at all. Even so, the response of the king in today's Gospel seems a little fierce, to burn down the city and destroy them from the face of the earth.

We shouldn't draw from this parable that God is waiting for us with thunderbolts, to strike us down when our enthusiasm lapses or we drift off in the homily. Not always easy to avoid. The description of the anger Jesus uses as a symbol of the determination of God to put everything right. God is repeatedly calling us to be in right relationship with him, to live lives of holiness that will bring us greater joy, peace and contentment than any worldly desire could.

When the Jewish people of the New Testament reject these calls, God does not abandon humanity, instead he invites the whole of humanity to come to the wedding feast, to rejoice and celebrate. All who respond to the King's invitation wholeheartedly are treated as friends and siblings in heaven.

Today, we are the ones to have that invitation from God directed to us. To come to Mass each Sunday and holy day of obligation. But do we respond to this call? We're asked to come to confession at least annually, or whenever we are weighed down with grave sin, but do we take up the chance? Today's Gospel is here to both encourage and challenge us, to lead us to respond wholeheartedly to the Lord's invitation and truly rejoice at the wedding feast that the Mass is. Even if we're a little late!
