The Fifth Sunday of Lent (B)
18th March 2018

In Peter writes:

By now our initial Lenten promises might have well worn thin, but there are still two weeks in which to rediscover that early Lenten spirit of prayer, fasting and almsgiving again. The death of Jesus on the Cross brings with it a perpetual revolution in religious understanding that has still needs to penetrate our individual or collective hearts. Indeed, this religious revolution is never completed because it involves the heart and not simply conformity to the external commands of the Law. This revolution is not the rejection of the Law as, the coherent structure of morality, as such. This new Law will, as Prophet Jeremiah proclaims, be written on the heart, and so the stakes are much higher. Lent is the season to look into our hearts to glimpse that divine writing once again. The celebration of the three days of Holy Week brings this writing into sharp focus as it gathers sacramental, moral and spiritual in the Liturgical celebration of the events at the heart of the Christian faith.

The birth of Jesus may be compared to planting a seed in the ground. The Word becomes flesh, but Jesus remains one person throughout his life. The gathering of a group of followers, Apostles, disciples and crowds, begins to indicate something more long-lasting that the life of one individual. The dynamic of Jesus' life is orientated towards establishing a living community. The city of Jerusalem is filled with different schools of religious learning, whether Jewish, Christian or Muslim, that perpetuate the Master's teaching. Jesus did not set up a school in this fashion. The school that Jesus set up is the Church, a spiritual and bodily community animated by His Holy Spirit. This community potentially includes the whole world. The Greeks who are seeking to see Jesus, represent 'the men and women of good will' from the pagan nations, and these peoples will be gathered together, with the people of the promise into one community. The single grain that was Jesus' human life had to die in order to yield this universal fruit.

This Sunday's Gospel focuses around the submission of Jesus to the Father's will. Jesus allows the Father to choose the means of salvation, and this would not involve avoiding dangerous situations, nor of a return to a previous human life such as Lazarus experienced.

Instead it would be victory through death, and in this way God's name would be glorified, because all people may now be gathered together through Jesus Christ. The acceptance by Jesus of God's will embodies the phrase from the Our Father; 'hallowed by thy name'.

The invitation to every follower of Jesus is to accept the same divine process to guide our life-choices. Jesus is not passive in front of His Father's will. It always remains the spiritual power behind His mission. The same is true for ourselves, the Father's will for us is not discovered through indolence but through striving, whether at school, University, family or work. The will of God is not discovered outside daily life but from within, just as life is experienced now and not in some mythical future, whether it be on holiday, in another job, with another invented person or in retirement. God does not speak to us through our phantasies but only through the real life of hard graft.

Jesus responded to the hour that marked His life, the challenge is whether we are able to do so in our own circumstances. The Passion of Jesus changes the religious dynamic between God and humanity, as we are invited to participate in His hour. Now it is personal, heart to heart, and thus open to the richness that includes memories of the past that need purification, hope for the future that need realisation, and the power of the present moment for conversion. The paradox of this personal dynamic between God and humanity through Jesus Christ is that the explicit rejection of this dynamic is tantamount to passing judgement on oneself. To have encountered Jesus Christ in His community and to reject explicitly that community is to admit that one prefers the dark to the light. To neither accept nor reject Jesus' community is to accept, albeit unconsciously, that life itself has no great narrative, and the narratives of shared human life have very shallow roots subject to the vicissitudes of fashion and ego
