Lent is always a call to all of us to be changed and transformed in Christlike holiness. The most important thing is understand is that God never withholds his grace from us. His steadfast love and mercy is new every (Lamentations 3:22-23). Through the gift and grace of the Holy Spirit we can be changed and made new in Christ. can set us free from all that hinders and holds us back. Jesus never lost an opportunity to bring freedom to those

oppressed by sin and guilt. His frequent association with sinners, however, upset the sensibilities of the religious leaders. When a woman caught in adultery was brought to them for trial, they confronted Jesus on the issue of retribution. Jewish law treated adultery as a serious crime since it violated God's ordinance and wreaked havoc on the stability of marriage and family life. It was one of the three gravest sins punishable by death. This incident tells us a great deal about Jesus' attitude to the sinner. The scribes and Pharisees wanted to entrap with the religious and civil authorities. That is why they brought a woman adultery before Jesus. Jesus caught in challenge towards turned the accusers. In effect he said: Go ahead and stone her! But let the one who is without sin be the first to cast a stone. The Lord leaves the matter to their own consciences. When the adulterous woman is left alone with Jesus, he both expresses mercy and he strongly exhorts her to not sin again. The scribes wished to condemn, Jesus wished to forgive and restore the sinner to health. His to challenge involved a choice - either go back to your former way of sin and death or to reach out to the new way of life and happiness with him. Jesus gave her pardon and a new start on life. 

# SUNDAY READINGS & PRAYERS

#### Entrance Antiphon: Cf. Ps 42: 1-2

Give me justice, O God, and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless. From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, for you, O God, are my strength.

By your help, we beseech you, Lord our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for the world, your Son handed himself over to death. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

## First reading: Isaiah 43:16-21

Thus says the Lord, who made a way through the sea, a path in the great waters; who put chariots and horse in the field and a powerful army which lay there never to rise again, snuffed out, put out like a wick: No need to recall the past, no need to think about what was done before. See, I am doing a new deed, even now it comes to light; can you not see it? Yes, I am making a road in the wilderness, paths in the wilds. The wild beasts will honour me, jackals and ostriches, because I am putting water in the Wilderness (rivers in the wild) to give my chosen people drink.
