FR CHRISTIAN WRITES:

What ties together the readings the Church gives us to meditate upon this morning is the centrality of the scriptures, the written word of God, to both of them. What is given in the Old Testament, is taken up, and fulfilled in the New. In the first reading we hear about Ezra the priest reading to the people of Israel. In the gospel reading we hear of another public reading of the word of God, the Scriptures.

Let us imagine: there is total hush. Every eye is fixed on Jesus as He reads, He finishes, He sits down, and then He speaks. What does He say? "This text is being fulfilled today, even as you listen." Make no mistake, everyone knows what this means. Our Lord has read from the beginning of a prophesy about the Messiah, the Christ, and he is claiming to be that Messiah. Everything which follows flows from this. His life, miracles, and, most especially, the mystery of his suffering, death and resurrection.

In the Gospel, that same word is read, but in a new way. Now it is being read by the Word made flesh himself. The Word of God reads the word of God and so fulfils it. All those obscure passages, difficult, faint echoes of what is to come, are now made clear. What is foretold and foreshadowed in the Old Testament is made manifest and is fulfilled in the New. Think of the Old Testament as being like a seed and the New Testament as the tree which grows from that seed. The seed is planted and from it shoots forth the tree. The tree is different from the seed but it is utterly inseparable from the seed. Without the seed it cannot exist.

What ties these two readings together is the centrality of the scriptures, the written word of God, to both of them. As with everything in the Old Testament, what is given in the Old Testament, is taken up, and fulfilled in the New. Thus, in these readings we see the intimate relationship between the Old and New Testaments and we hear of the first explicit claim by our Lord to being the Christ, Son of the Living God.

How are we to apply this in our lives? What should this mean for us in our own journey of faith? Firstly, we should take this as a call to be attentive to the voice of God in scripture. The tree of the gospel born of the seed of the Old Testament produces fruit of its own and so a new seed can be planted in those who eat it, growing into a tree of life within them. Look at the people of Israel in the first reading. So often we hear about the failure of the people of Israel, their rebellions and so on. But here they are a true example to us all. As it is written: "all the people listened attentively to the book of the law." From dawn till dusk. Why? Because, as the psalm tells us "the law of the Lord is perfect, it revives the soul... it gives wisdom to the simple... light to the eyes." Again, in the gospel, the as the Word of God reads from the scriptures, "all the eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him." Total attention. Attention to the words being read, and also to the Word made flesh in front of them. Are we like this when we hear the bible read? Do we take time to read the bible ourselves?

Notice one more thing in these readings. None of it is done alone. The people listen to Ezra together, the synagogue listens to Jesus together. Our bible reading must always be the same. We may be physically alone when we read the bible, but we must always do it as Catholics, in union with the Church, guarded in every age from all error by the Holy Spirit. Scripture is often obscure, difficult to understand and, while no explanation of scripture can truly express the full music which comes from these silent pages, if we read it with the Church. With the divine assembly of God's people, we will not twist it, we will not reform it in our own image, but it will reform us in its image.
