FR CHRISTIAN WRITES:

Throughout history, in every time and place, people have worked tirelessly to destroy their enemies and rejoiced with gay abandon when it came. It is often difficult to love our neighbour as we ought. The task may seem overwhelming at times, especially when we hardly feel we have time to keep things together ourselves. How much more for those who are our enemies. Yet today Our Lord gives us this extraordinary, revolutionary and yet binding commandment: love your enemies.

While this may seem madness at first, the deep wisdom of what Our Lord commands us is clear if we reflect upon it for a while. Note, firstly, that he commands us to love them, not like them. We cannot control who we like very well, but we can control who we love. As we heard about a few weeks ago, love can be simply described as an act of the will to work for the good of the other. The good of anyone, including our enemies, is, above all, that they should avoid evil and do good. If we have been the victim of some evil on their part then working for them to recognise and repent of that evil is very much the loving thing to do. If, on the other hand, we have wronged our enemy as least as much as he has wronged us then we know that repentance is needed on both sides.

This leads us to the second piece of great wisdom I would like to discuss in what Our Lord says today: the great value of reconciliation without recrimination. As believers in a just and loving God, we cannot doubt that whatever wrong has been done on earth, whether to us or to other people, will be repaid by God. Our God is a God of mercy and justice. This should give us the confidence to move on from mutual resentment without fear that we are abandoning those wronged in the past. How many ancient ethnic and national hatreds mar our world? How many of those hatreds have lead to unspeakable crimes in every century, including our own? These hatreds are often the result of real wrongs and genuine grievances, but they remain a festering wound so long as they are held. We English Catholics, to take one tiny example, do not abandon the memory of our martyrs if we are kind and friendly to our Anglican neighbours. For one thing, it was, after all, Anglicans who voted for our emancipation two hundred years ago. Animosity would serve no good purpose and would damage both us and the image of Christians as a whole. We love and honour our martyrs, we remember with sorrow the persecutions, confiscations, destructions and murders. But we do all this while united with all people of good will in our determination that such things should never happen again.

So, while the call to "love your enemies" may seem madness at first, we see that it is, in fact, true wisdom. God is just, God is merciful, we leave things in His hands and know that all will be well in the end.
