FR CHRISTIAN WRITES:

The prodigal son is in many ways the model of modern man: he strikes out bold and independent. He will make his own way in the world. But already at this stage there are little, background problems. Why is the prodigal son "squandering his money on a life of debauchery"? Because he thinks it is awfully fun, we might suppose to be the first reason. Well, yes, it might be amusing for a while. But there is an emptiness here. The prodigal son is cut off from his family. He has his wealth, but the source of that wealth, the family farm, he has left behind. He has gone off to a far distant country. He is a man alone.

The prodigal son is alone with nothing but finite pleasures to comfort him. Pleasure, for him, is nothing more than a drug to help him hide from the emptiness he has created in his own heart. Is this not the human condition? We find ourselves in this world as finite creatures. We look up into the stars, into the vast abyss of space and think that we are nothing, that it all ends in death. It is for good reason scripture call humanity without Christ "a people who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death."

It takes a fall into poverty to bring the prodigal son to his senses. When his riches run out and he cannot pay for any more pleasures to mask his own emptiness that the prodigal son sees that he must return to his father or die alone. Here is one of the reasons why God has always particularly loved the poor. Poverty is not, of course, a good thing in itself. It is painful, and grinding and miserable and we must do all in our power to alleviate it. But, those who are in it are at least more likely to see the truth of their own condition. They are not shackled to this earth with chains of gold and silver.

So the son returns to the bosom of his family, to the joy of being welcomed home, to a circle of love. Had he ever realised how loved he was? Given his actions, probably not. It is the shock of his degradation which brings the son to his senses. So we see good being brought out of bad, joy out of despair, hope out of hopelessness, suffering to resurrection.
