FR CHRISTIAN WRITES:

Today is Pentecost Sunday, traditionally also called Whitsun in England. We celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples gathered in the upper room.

The Holy Spirit, promised by Christ now arrives to bring inspiration and passion to the disciples who convert as many as five thousand people. This is why today is often called "the birthday of the Church."

But who is the Holy Spirit? We are more familiar with the two other persons of the Holy Trinity: God the Father and God the Son. They seem easier to envision because the speak to us directly. The Holy Spirit is, however, God just as much as they are, but He does not interact with us in quite the same way.

The Holy Spirit is, above all, He who makes known. As St Paul says quite plainly "No one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God." In ancient times the Holy Spirit spoke "through the prophets", as we say in the Creed. But since Pentecost the Holy Spirit has been the one who reveals Christ in our hearts. The Holy Spirit does not speak of Himself, as Christ says He "will not speak on His own." Rather, He is the grace poured into our hearts to give us the gift of faith. Christ tells us that "the world cannot receive [the Spirit], because it neither sees Him nor knows Him," but that those who believe in Christ know the Spirit because he dwells within them.

If the Spirit dwells within all the baptised He is truly the Spirit of the Body of Christ (which is the Church). And this role is not just a meaningless title. The Holy Spirit has an extremely important role in the life of the Church. It is the Spirit who guides the Church throughout the ages and allows us to know the will of God.

How? Firstly, it is the Spirit who inspires the Scriptures. The authority of the Bible is His authority. Secondly, the Spirit speaks to us in Sacred Tradition, that is to say the teaching and way of life which the Apostles handed down to us to be preserved till the end of time through the Magisterium (authoritative teaching) of the Church, which He guides. Thirdly, we know the Spirit in prayer. Most particularly we know Him in the sacraments, through the words and symbols inspired by the Holy Spirit which put us into communion with Christ. But not only there, also whenever and wherever we pray and call to Him for inspiration. Finally, the Holy Spirit inspires the different gifts which the saints have had over the centuries and the glorious achievements of them and their assistants. We need only think of the endless array of Catholic martyrs, missionaries, monks, hermits, educators, medics and monarchs who have for twenty centuries been the love of Christ to the world.
