FR CHRISTIAN WRITES:

The matter I want to discuss below can be an extremely emotive one, and often touches our own lives personally, through our friends or through our families. Without wishing to offend, misunderstandings spread in the popular press must be clarified, and it is important to re-state what our faith's actual position is. If you or someone close to you have been directly affected by anything discussed below, never forget that Christ's arms are always outstretched for us, and that His love can overcome anything.

What has happened in America? In 1973, the United States Supreme Court issued a judgment making human abortion, undertaken for any reason whatsoever, up to the point of birth itself, a legal right in their country. This resulted in the US

having the most extreme laws in the world, excepting only North Korea and China. On 24th June the US Supreme Court overturned that judgement on the grounds that the US constitution says nothing about human abortion whether in favour or against it.

It will, therefore, be up to popularly elected legislators to decide how the practice should be regulated. For most Americans there will be no change. In some areas democratically elected assemblies have passed laws either regulating the practice, as we do in Britain and most of Europe, or prohibiting it where the pregnancy does not risk the life of the mother.

The following things have been stated in the press and are untrue: 1) that the pro-life movement wishes to criminalise people who suffer the tragedy of miscarriage; 2) that Christians only care about children before they are born. (In fact, Christians are significantly more likely to adopt than our secular friends and neighbours and also give significantly more to charity); 3) that men are forcing this change on women. (In reality, women are more likely to hold pro-life views than men); 4) that there is no democratic mandate for regulating the matter. (In fact, 71% of Americans favour some kind of regulation). This list is not exhaustive, but it is important to be wary of what we hear on the news.

How does this effect Britain? This change does not directly affect anyone here. In England, human abortion is only permitted up to the 24th week of pregnancy and, even then, only for a serious reason. This country's legal system does not recognise a "right to abortion", no matter what some — even those in government — might say. The vast majority of the British people believe human abortion should not be permitted after the 24th week of pregnancy. We should be wary of importing American slogans and angry rhetoric.

What does our faith say about this? Our faith teaches that we should build a society where no women should feel they must be subjected to this procedure, where fathers are always required to do their duty, and where women in trouble are properly cared for by the whole community. Since the time of the Apostles, in every time and in all places our faith has held that all innocent human life is worthy of protection from conception until natural death. This does not mean there are not excellent and compelling arguments for why certain people at certain times would not be in a good position to care for a child, but it does mean that a fundamental human right cannot ever be put aside. Ectopic pregnancies, and other dangerous complications, however, can be treated to save the life of the mother, even if the child does not survive the procedure.

Why does our faith teach this? We believe this both because it has been believed by the Church since her beginning, and because modern science has proven that human life begins at conception. A foetus, however small, is an independent human life. To say that a foetus has no rights would be to define human rights as only applying to certain human beings. Along with many secular people we believe that it is wrong to deny human rights to any group.
