FR CHRISTIAN WRITES:

A consistent theme throughout the scriptures, growing louder and louder as we pass from the whispered prophecies Genesis, through the thundering pronouncements of Isaiah and Elijah, to the glories of the coming of the Son of God, is Divine Providence. Our God shows Himself to be the Lord of History. While His people may suffer, they always do with the sure and certain hope of the promised salvation to come.

The centrality of this fact is vital to understanding the genius and bravery of our patron, who we celebrate today, St Ignatius Loyola.

St Ignatius, even among saints, is an extraordinary figure. He straddles the line between the Middle Ages and the Early Modern world in every aspect of his work and personality. The passionate romance of the medieval knight is, in him, united to

the pragmatic organisational skill, emphasis on education and love of dynamism of early modernity.

Like the medieval knights errant, the young Ignatius was thrilled by tales of military dare and do. His mind filled with images of burnished breast plates, heroic victories and delicate poems composed for the fair ladies at court, Ignatius became a soldier. As so often happens to a young soldier, however, Ignatius found that army life is not all like that. He was seriously wounded in battle and left to rest and recuperate in an isolated castle with only the scriptures and a few devotional books to keep him company. Here, in his isolation, the soldier started to become the saint.

St Ignatius, in a strikingly modern way, began to observe his interior life and the working of his own mind. He found that when he daydreamed about earthly glory he would often be left with a feeling of emptiness afterwards. When he read the scriptures and contemplated the life of Christ and the saints, however, he later found himself feeling uplifted and content. Over several weeks he explored this phenomenon and slowly his true conversion began to set in. In this we see the origin of what was later to become the founding text of his spiritual method: The Spiritual Exercises.

The passionate young knight now abandoned his search for earthly glory, and decided to become a soldier of Christ. In this his faith in Divine Providence was invaluable. The situation for the Church across the world was dire. The Protestant "reformation" had swept Europe, leaving the united Christendom of the Middle Ages in tatters. Over 50% of the Catholic world had broken with the Church's faith. It seemed that Catholicism was rapidly becoming a thing from a past age. St Ignatius knew, however, that while Almighty God may allow His Church to be tested, Christ Himself promised that it was indestructible.

With a group of friends, including St Francis Xavier, he approached the altar and swore to work without cease, never counting the cost, not only to restore Christendom, but to expand it by sending missionaries to bring the mercy of God to every people, on every continent.

With a new, radical oath of special obedience to the Holy Father in Rome, St Ignatius' new Society of Jesus was to become the powerhouse of the growing Catholic reform movement. Wherever they went, the sons of St Ignatius swept away the late medieval rot within the Church and boldly challenged the Church's attackers. Through every means the Jesuits answered challenges and taught the truth. In 150 years, the Protestant movement shrank from controlling 60% of Christendom to a mere 20%. Catholic Poland was saved and Catholic Goa came into being.

Our patron stands as a giant of his age, and an inspiration to Catholic reformers and educators in every age. Like him, let us not be afraid of the challenges of our times, but put our faith in Divine Providence. "All for the greater glory of God!"
