FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

Finally we are approaching Christmas! The period of preparation is coming to an end and we now within those last seven days which lead up to Our Lord's Nativity which are characterised by a move away from a more vague longing towards an active anticipation of the entering of God into His creation, God becoming man for man's salvation. God becoming man so that man might become god.

In that spirit here are presented seven beautiful prayers for us to meditate on over the coming week. To most they are best known through the hymn "O come, o come Immanuel." That hymn's seven verses are loosely based on the seven prayers. These are what are called "The O Antiphons."

Antiphons are little short prayers which top and tail each psalm recited as part of the church's cycle of prayer called the Liturgy of the Hours, or "the Office." They are a series of services made up of sets of psalms, readings and other prayers which all monks, nuns, sisters and priests recite to sanctify the day and to pray for themselves and the whole Church, throughout the day, every day.

The "O Antiphons" are amongst the most ancient prayers of the Church, being at least 1500 years old. They are for the beginning and end of the high point of vespers (evening prayer), which is the recitation of Our Lady's song of praise, the Magnificat. They are called "O" antiphons because they all start with the exclamation "O."

Each begins with a title for the Messiah and refers to the prophecies of Isaiah and carries mystical Old Testament references, while also carrying an element of the New Covent. These two characteristics are put next to each other and a third dimension emerges which serves as a point of meditation when considering the Incarnation.

O Wisdom, coming forth from the mouth of the Most High, reaching from one end to the other, mightily and sweetly ordering all things:
Come and teach us the way of prudence.

O Adonai, and leader of the House of Israel, who appeared to Moses in the fire of the burning bush, and gave him the law on Sinai: Come and redeem us with an outstretched arm.

O Root of Jesse, standing as a sign among the peoples; before you kings will shut their mouths, to you the nations will make their prayer: Come and deliver us, and delay no longer.

O Key of David and sceptre of the House of Israel; you open and no one can shut; you shut and no one can open:
Come and lead the prisoners from the prison house, those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

O Morning Star,

splendour of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.

O King of the nations, and their desire, the cornerstone making both one: Come and save the human race, which you fashioned from clay.

O Emmanuel, our king and our lawgiver, the hope of the nations and their Saviour: Come and save us, O Lord our God.
