#### **FR CHRISTIAN WRITES**

At the beginning of His public ministry our Lord had one simple message: "repent, and believe the gospel." Repentance: the setting aside of everything within us which is not of God and turning towards the gospel with all our hearts is the very essence of being a true disciple, true conversion. But true interior conversion must, naturally, lead us to express our new outlook in actions. We need, in short, to become better people. We must get rid of bad habits, vices, and build up good habits, virtues. During Lent in a particular way we are called to do this by imitating our Lord's forty days of fasting in the desert. As St John says "by my works will show you my faith."

We do this in three ways: prayer, fasting and alms giving. Each helps us in a different way to discipline ourselves, shedding our sinful vices and building up virtues.

Prayer is certainly the first and most important part of becoming a better Christian. As our Lord says "without me you can do nothing." Christ carried the sins of the whole world on His back as He claimed the hill of Calvary. It was hard, but He alone had the strength to do it. He wants us to put our own sins, and all our troubles, onto His back. As He said just before His suffering: "I was born for this." Even when we do not feel the repentance we should feel, we can at least ask God to give us the grace of true repentance. More than that, we can also ask for the grace we need to be strong in the future.

Fasting is something we do less than in the past. Our ancestors in the faith, for more than a thousand years, would have eaten no meat for all of Lent and only eaten on full meal a day! It would probably be unwise for most of us to try to copy them, but we can and should give up something. This helps to crush the sin of greed within us, helps to build up our self-control and can also leave aside a little spare money which we can use to help the needy.
