FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

The cycle of readings for Lent is one of the most ancient parts of our Lectionary. In the early church, as is often the case today, Lent is a time of intense preparation for the catechumens (those preparing for baptism) to ready themselves for their reception into the Church at Easter. This story about the Samaritan woman has always been part of that.

Why? Because this passage, though seemly obscure, is filled with rich imagery about redemption, about being taken from among those who have strayed and are rejected and are made righteous through water and the Holy Spirit.

The Samaritan woman, as Samaritans always do in the gospels, represents one who has been rejected on account of her sins. But she also corresponds to a great many women throughout the scriptures who find love and a husband while visiting a well. If we think of the Old Testament figures of Jacob and Moses, for example, we see that they meet and court their wives by a well. So she is both a sinful woman, and also a woman who is associated with the greatest of the ancient matriarchs.

This duality continues in what she says. She is sarcastic with our Lord, she tries to defend her sects heretical views about where the temple should be, and she attempts to lie about her past relationships. But she also recognises our Lord as who He really is. She says that He is a "prophet." For Samaritans there was only one prophet, who was to be the Messiah, so she is truly recognising who he is. Finally, she goes on from her meeting with our Lord to become a missionary to her people, and to understand that in Christ we not only meet salvation, but the fullest revelation of our deepest selves, beloved creatures of God ("he told me all I have ever done." The imagery, therefore, is of one who is rejected, and who has strayed in so many ways, but who is loved and courted anyway. Who is invited by Christ into intimate communion.

The parallels with baptism are fairly clear at this point. We are not called to our new life in Christ as people who deserve it, as people who are already good and holy. We are called from where we are, wherever we are, whoever we are and whatever we have done. We might even find that difficult and fight back against it, as the woman does, but the power of grace can break our hearts of stone if we sit with our Lord in intimate prayer, if we let Him truly speak.
