#### FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

This Sunday, the fourth after Easter, is traditionally called "Good Shepard Sunday" because of the pastoral imagery used by Our Lord in today's gospel. Christ the Good Shepherd has, since the earliest centuries, been a powerful image for the faithful. The earliest artistic depictions of Our Lord which we have shown Him as the Good Shepherd. Perhaps this is unsurprising: it is such a comforting and beautiful image. The one who will watch

over us, the one who will lead us to greener pastures, the one who will come to find us when we are lost, and the one who will fight off the wolves which may attack us.

The Church has long connected this aspect of Our Lord's ministry very closely with those who are charged with the pastoral care of the Church: the priests. Truly it is the very best image of what priesthood is all about. It is about watching for the stray, comforting those in difficulty, leading to greener pastures and, above all, self-sacrifice for the flock. It is a very grave charge: Our Lord personally gave the ministry of offering the Sacrifice of the Mass for the living and the dead, absolving sinners and teaching the faith to His first priests, the Apostles.

This ministry is a wonderful joy in so many ways, but the chief joy is the people. As St John Vianney said: "The priest is not a priest for himself; he does not give himself absolution; he does not administer the Sacraments to himself... he is not for himself, he is for you."

Across the world today there are still many thousands of young men who are prepared to take the route less trodden and to embrace all the difficulties which being a priest in today's world may bring. I can attest to this myself, I was only ordained in 2016.

But just as the priest is for the people, so the priest cannot be without the people. Above all this means prayer. Without prayer nothing can be accomplished. Without prayer priests will be wicked, priests will be few and priests will be useless. With prayer, however, priests will be holy, priests will be many and priests will bring ever more souls into communion with the Living God.

To live in the midst of the world without wishing its pleasures; To be a member of each family, yet belonging to none; To share all suffering; to penetrate all secrets; To heal all wounds; to go from men to God and offer Him their prayers; To return from God to men to bring pardon and hope; To have a heart of fire for Charity, and a heart of bronze for Chastity To teach and to pardon, console and bless always. My God, what a life; and it is yours, O priest of Jesus Christ. Lacordaire
