FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

This past week we celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This great feast of the Church particularly concentrates on the central reality of Our Lord's incarnation: the embodiment of the love of God within a human heart. His heart is like ours in all things but sin, yet above that. It burns with a love beyond all that we could comprehend. Love is the beginning and end of all things in our faith, and, indeed, it is the beginning and end of all things as a whole. After all, the God who is "alpha and omega, the beginning and the end" is also simply defined by St John with the words "God is love."

But what is love? Love is a vast, multifaceted phenomenon which ranges from our love for our parents, our love for our friends, our love for strangers and the love with feel for a fiancé or spouse. What unites them all is that, in every case, love means a deep-seated desire for the good of the other.

This is, however, no mere "wishing someone well." No, love is passionate, it is a fire which spurs us on. When we see injustice done to our beloved can, and should, feel a burning thirst for justice. When we see our beloved suffer can, and should wish to move heaven and earth to save them.

None of this, however, means that love need be meek and mild. If a mother were to see her toddler putting his hand into an electrical socket she would naturally cry out and bat the child's hand away from danger. Maybe the child cries, and is frustrated, but the mother knows her duty as a loving parent. This is true for our love of all people: it does not mean we should be weak in the face of error or of people hurting themselves and their souls. We are called to challenge, sometimes, out of love.

Nevertheless, it is important that our love be apparent. Sometimes this is difficult, but when someone knows you love them and care about them they will be much more likely to listen and respond to us. They are more likely to see our help for them as something more than condescension. They may ask "what is this love? Why does this person care about me?" It is there that people begin to see the love of Jesus Christ shining through.
