The film is a call to action, and so after the screening we will have some time to agree what next steps we can take as individuals, as a parish, and as part of the wider community.

FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

Last Thursday the Church in England celebrated the feast of two of our greatest martyrs: St John Fisher and St Thomas More. The legacy of these martyrs, as well as all the other martyrs of the so-called Reformation, is one which we are all a part of. It was by their courage, witness and prayers that our own parish exits, that the Mass is still celebrated in every part of England and

that the faith of our fathers has endured "in spite of dungeon, fire and sword."

St John Fisher and St Thomas More are, however, particularly special. This is not only because of how early they were but because of how prominent they were and what such extraordinary lives they led before they made their sacrifice.

St John Fisher was the only one among the bishops of England who remained loyal to the faith in face of persecution. After nearly a thousand years of Catholic England, in a land filled with churches, priests, monks, and pious lay people, the shepherds tasked by God with the government of the Church in England abandoned their posts at the first sign of trouble. Perhaps we should not be surprised that it was St John Fisher who stood firm, however. His spiritual writings are still worth reading today, and his fame as a pastor and spiritual counsellor during his lifetime show the measure of the man.

St Thomas More was also a prominent man: Lord Chancellor of England (effectively Prime Minister). In that task he was famously just and impartial. At a time when bribes were common, he was unusual in refusing all offers. Not only that, he was a famous man of letters, maintaining friendships with many of the great intellectuals of the day, from all over Europe. He pioneered women's education by creating a system for educating his daughters, who became famous for their intelligence, wit and charm.

For both of these men the call of conscience rang clear and loud. They remained loyal subjects of the king till death, but knew that no man, whoever he may be, has the right to force a Christian to abandon his faith. They refused the oath declaring the king "Supreme Head of the Church", for Christ is our only Head and He has placed the governance of the Church into the hands of the bishops, with and under the Successor to St Peter alone.

The words of St Thomas himself best describe his heroic stand: "this indictment [against me] is grounded upon an Act of Parliament, directly repugnant to the Laws of God and his Holy Church, the Supreme Government of which, or of any part thereof, no temporal person may by any Law presume to take upon him, being what right belongs to the See of Rome, which by special prerogative was granted by the mouth of our saviour, Christ himself, to St. Peter, and the Bishops of Rome his Successors only, whilst he lived, and was personally present here on Earth: it is therefore, amongst Catholic Christians, insufficient in Law, to charge any Christian to obey it."

The poignant words put into his mouth by the playwright Robert Dolt echo to us as a true cry for Christian freedom against tyranny: "I am the King's true subject. I pray for him and all the realm. I do none harm. I say none harm. I think none harm. And if this be not enough to keep a man alive, then in good faith I long not to live."
