FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

This coming Thursday, the 14th, will be the Feast of the Exultation of the Holy Cross. It is perhaps a peculiar thing that Christians, and Catholics in particular focus on the cross so much. We have crucifixes in our churches, our houses and in our school classrooms. It is an image of suffering, an image of death. From the earliest times, however, Christians have exalted in this image. As St Paul says first "God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ." Why? Because it is the ultimate symbol of both God's loving compassion, and His almighty power.

When we look upon the cross we see before us the utter beauty of God's humility. That He who made heaven and earth, should stoop to become like us, to be born like us, to live like us, to suffer like us, and to die as we all will die. And further yet, we see the lengths that God will go to for us, for love of us alone. "Greater love hath no man than this, to lay down his life for his friends" says our Lord. In another place scripture is also explicit "Why, one will hardly die for a righteous man - though perhaps for a good man one will dare even to die. But God shows his love for us in that while we were yet sinners Christ died for us.

Many people also find deep comfort in the image of the cross because it is the unbreakable sign of God's compassion. By this I mean the word literally: com-passion, to suffer-with. While God is almighty and transcends all, He has been where we are. When we are sad, when we are anxious, when we are in pain, we know when we look upon the Cross that Jesus Christ is truly 'Immanuel': God with us.
