FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

This Friday past the Church throughout the world celebrated the Memoria of Our Lady of Sorrows. This devotion to Our Lady at the food of the Cross, in the depths of her anguish at the death of her son, is one which has been central to much Catholic devotion for many centuries. On one level this can be hard to understand. Indeed, for many non-Catholics the images of Our Lady streaming with tears, is one of the most alien aspects of our faith. One might ask: why is this image of distress so important? did she not know that Our Lord would rise again? where was her faith in that sorrow?

The answer to all of these questions can be summed up in one word: compassion. Com-passion, to suffer-with. Our Lady was chosen before the world began to be perfect in all things, perfect mirror of the love of God, this is why we call her the Immaculate. The most perfect object of this overwhelming love was her divine son. She loved Him with that love any true mother should have but, as it were, with the volume turned right up. It was a love of such completeness and depth that it is quite beyond what any of us might comprehend. How did this love, therefore, respond when Our Lady saw this supreme object of her love whipped, degraded and left to die upon that cross? It responded in the most natural way: she suffered with Him. We all know this personally: when we love someone, we are pained when they are pained, their loss tears at the very root of our souls. We suffer-with, have compassion.

Our Lady of Sorrows is, therefore, not merely a nice image but is, in my opinion, perhaps the most profoundly moving and most relatable image of Our Lady that there is. When we are mourning, when we see our loved ones suffer, when we feel that indescribable pain of true compassion, we know that we are not alone in that. Moreover, we see that this is not some meaningless suffering, but it is produced of our love. In looking upon Our Lady of Sorrows we are reminded again and again that love is not always easy, indeed, sometimes, upon this earth, love may ask the price of our compassion. But is that price not worth the payment?
