FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

During this week we have two of the greatest feasts of the angels. This began with the Feast of the Holy Archangels Michael, Gabriel and Raphael on Saturday. That feast forms a

pair with the feast of our Guardian Angels on Tuesday. The angels can seem quaint and minor figures in our faith if we only imagine them based on the delicate images we often see of them as gentle, winged servants of God or even little babies with wings. The reality of what an angel is, however, is so much more. In scripture we read frightening visions of six winged creatures with eyes of fire. No wonder the first reaction most visionaries had when confronted by angels was awe and terror. Our Lady herself needed the comforting words of Gabriel to comfort her when he brought the joyful news of Christ's conception: "do not be afraid Mary, you have found favour with God!" This is unsurprising since angels are not bound by the limitations of a body so have a level of power quite beyond anything a human being could have.

St Gabriel is commissioned by God to be the bringer of the most important news, appearing to the Prophet Daniel, to St Zechariah (father of St John the Baptist), and most importantly, to Our Lady. We pray to him for guidance.

St Raphael's name means "God heals" and is closely associated with the healing power of God. When we pray for his aid let us not forget that while God can cure sickness, the healing he brings to our souls is the greatest of all his miracles.

St Michael's is presented in scripture as the general of the heavenly armies, confronting the powers of hell. His name means "he who is like God." St Michael was, between 1888 and 1964, invoked by Catholics after daily Mass. Those prayers we first directed to freeing the Holy Father from persecution and then to the conversion of Russia from Godless communism. In both cases the prayers have born much fruit. St Michael is ready to help us in our most difficult spiritual battles.

The Guardian Angels, of course, often seem very much more humble creatures, but we should not forget that they are still powerful spirits and are particularly concerned with their charges, us.

We do not, I think, concern ourselves with them enough. As long ago as the 1930s the great French Catholic novelist George Bernarnos said, through the mouth of one of his characters, an old, wise parish priest ""We do not pray to Angels often enough. They frighten the theologians, like those ancient heresies from the East, a nervous fear, indeed! The world is filled with Angels." A devotion to the Guardian Angels is often extremely helpful in evangelisation. St Francis de Sales, a French bishop and great evangelist who received over 40,000 converts into the church during his life, said this of the guardian angels:

"Make yourself very familiar with the Angels; see them often invisibly present in your life, and above all, love and revere the angel of the diocese in which you live, those of the persons with whom you live and especially your own. Invoke them often... and make use of their help and assistance in your affairs... so that they may co-operate with your intentions."

Also, the Blessed Peter Faber, a companion of St Ignatius, founder of the Jesuit order said that during his missions to reevangelise Germany he found the intercession of guardian angels very helpful. He recounted how he was given the most wonderful consolation as he asked for the intercession of the guardian angel of each parish and how he felt their protection from ambushes by those opposed to his message.
