FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

The parable in today's gospel is one which has a clear meaning in the context of Our Lord's own day, but we would be mistaken to think it is not also addressed to all of us today.

Let us first look at the meaning of the parable in the context of Our Lord's own day. The symbolism Our Lord uses picks up the symbolism used in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, which we heard in the first reading, among other places in the Old Testament. The vineyard is a symbol of Israel, and her destiny as the garden in which the fruit of human salvation will be brought forth. The owner is, of course, God Himself and the tenants are the people of Israel, particularly their leaders. The servants sent to the tenants are the prophets. With all these symbols understood we can now see that Our Lord is clearly addressing those who had ignored the message of the prophets and, indeed, would soon rise up and kill God the Son Himself, for repeating the message of salvation. The master is entitled, therefore, to take this vineyard away and give it to others. The leaders will be replaced with the new leaders, the apostles. The rest of the people, however, are not replaced. Rather, in the bounty of His mercy, God goes further than simply accepting them, even after all that has happened, He wishes to open the gates of the vineyard to all the people of the world, to welcome people of every nation to the table of the Lord.

This message is not, however, merely limited to Our Lord's own context. It has its own applications in every age, including our own. We, the members of the Church of today, are just as prone to ignoring the promptings of God and departing from the way He has laid out for us as any ancient Israelite. Indeed, we have less of an excuse as we have the message of Christ! This parable is, therefore, also a call to repentance for us. When do we ignore or even oppose what we know is right? What we know, in Christ, we are called to? Do we fail to pray? Fail to try to keep humble before God? Do we allow our vices to grow and our virtues to wither? From time to time we are all guilty of these and many other faults. But we can never despair because we have a God who has sent His only Son, who has let that Son die for each and every one of us, who would do it all again if He had to. A God such as this also always open to our return to Him.
