FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

The essence of what Our Lord tells us in today's gospel is at once beautiful, appealing, inspiring and a very difficult! It is, in effect, a call to be perfect. In the life of Christ God enters into our broken condition and reform it, remould it to be what it truly should be: perfect, the reflection of God's own image and a reflection of the perfect Goodness which God created from the beginning and will return all things too in the end.

To help us in this God has revealed his Law to us, which the words of Christ we hear today summarises. This is not an arbitrary law imposed for no reason, but is the very secrets of happiness, of what we must do to become truly human, to become truly loving people. He first revealed this to the ancient people of Israel. A lot of people think Jesus was saying something new when he revealed the golden rule: love God above all things and your neighbour as yourself. He first revealed this to the ancient people of Israel, as we saw in the first reading. Note that Christ specifically cites the Old Testament in today's gospel.

This is why Christ could not possibly have come to abolish the law. The moral law is eternal, it reflects the very inner life of God himself. He could never be abolished without God denying his own nature — which is, of course, impossible. What Christ does bring, however, is the completeness of the law. In His life he is, for us God's one, total, final Word. All that God could say to explain the law better is said in the life of Christ. He is the Word of God, and God has not got a second.

These moral laws, of course, can be very difficult. Our Lord lists a whole raft of strict commandments which he calls all Christians to follow. Our righteousness must go deeper than that of the Pharisees. So, does our Lord ask to much of us? No, he does not. Scripture says "if you wish, you can keep the commandments, to behave faithfully is within your power." This may leave us all feeling a little discouraged. But let us not forget that it is precisely because being good is so difficult that Christ came to give us a means to become better with God's help. Without God we can do nothing. Without his grace we cannot become better. With grace, however, and with the forgiveness of God poured out in baptism and confession, we can always become the saints God made us to be.
