#### **FR CHRISTIAN WRITES**

Today is the great Solemnity of Christ the King. Throughout the scriptures Our Lord is referred to as "the king of kings" and royal imagery abounds. But what do we really mean in a concrete way when we say Christ is king? Christ tells us in one place that his is not a kingdom of this world. So, perhaps we should take from this that the kingdom is something only for the future? Perhaps God will do it in his own time? No. Christ also says "I am a king... and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice."

When the bible or the church speaks of "the world" it can mean more than one thing. On one level there is the world which we all live in, created by God to be good, and which is good and which Christ said he "came not to condemn, but to save." But "the world" can also be a general term for what one might loosely call "the system" - all those things which are products of the fall: greed, envy, faithlessness, institutional injustice and so on. Christ's kingdom is certainly not of that world. But it is still very real, and Christ the King demands the obedience of all peoples, and all governments to the law of love.

What does this concretely mean for us? How should we respond to this? We must not leave our faith a home when we are in the public forum or make decisions about right and wrong in the world. There is a certain natural law, built on Christ's law of love, which is binding on the consciences of all people which we are called to share. In short we should always act in our public as well as in our private lives, according to what our conscience thinks is best: our conscience must be informed by out Catholic faith, the teachings of Christ. What it really centres around is love. If we truly love one another we will try to remember every single person, people who are loved by Christ and by us, as people dedicated to building up Christ's kingdom.

Yes, we must think of our families and those we have to look after first. But we also need to always act for the good of all but with special concern to the most vulnerable in our society This is what the Church calls, "the preferential option for the poor." Always acting with a special concern for the most vulnerable members of our society. Those who cannot afford the basic necessities of life, the disabled and the unborn. This is of putting Christ's law of love into practise and so building his kingdom.

This law of Love is one of the reasons why Catholicism has always opposed governments which support one group against the good of another group – for example, racist governments which support one racial group at the expense of another, or governments entirely in the pockets of the rich, or communist governments.

At the moment I am sure we can think of many places where this law of love is not obeyed. The oppression of the people of China, the treatment of so many civilians in the war in Ukraine. These are prime examples of resistance to Christ's law of love for all people, of resistance to his kingdom.

So, let us re-commit ourselves today to acting in our private and public lives in accordance with Christ's law of love and so build up his kingdom.
