## **FR CHRISTIAN WRITES**

Today we celebrated the final day in our Twelve Days of Christmas, the Epiphany of the Lord. In particular we remembered the visit of the Wise Men, or 'Magi,' to the Holy Family. We do not actually know much about who the Magi were from the bible: for one thing we don't know if there were three of them and even if they were all men! We know that Magi were Persian court philosophers filled with great learning and who also had a particular fascination with astronomy. Any peculiar celestial activity would never have escaped their attention.

But what is the meaning of this visit? Firstly and foremostly the visit of the Magi is a prefiguration in Our Lord's childhood His destiny of opening up the New Covenant to all the nations of the world. This is why we call this feast the Epiphany, a word meaning "showing" (as in, the showing of Christ to all the nations). Traditionally the Magi are represented as being African, Arab and European. This again emphasises to us the universality of Our Lord's mission. This is also why the Magi have often been represented by Christian artists as kings, it echoes

the words of the Psalmist "may all kings fall down before him."

Another important aspect of the Epiphany is that the Magi are scholars. For these past two thousand years men and women of deep learning have turned to Christ as their saviour. This is, of course, the action of grace first of all, but it is also because the search for true wisdom has its natural end in Christ. Our Lord is Himself the Truth, He is the fullness of Wisdom and Knowledge: the Word of God. The ancient Fathers of the Church often emphasised this to the pagan world they were trying to convert: the search for Truth naturally leads towards He who is Truth. Christians are never afraid of study or open enquiry as we know that all truth is one, truth cannot stand against truth. The Truth of our faith is compatible with all real wisdom and knowledge.
