FR CHRISTIAN WRITES

This Sunday is one which has been recently dedicated in a particular way to meditating on the gift of the scriptures. The Holy Bible, a collection of histories, prophecies, parables, poems, prayers and revelations, is central to our Christian understanding of who God is and even of ourselves. As St Paul succinctly puts it: "All scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16).

As Catholic Christians we understand God as one who, while unknowable in Himself, has, by His infinite love and mercy, revealed Himself to us. God's revelation to us is very different from every other piece of knowledge we might have. Most knowledge we have not directly come to through our own senses is taken on faith. We might have faith that our doctor knows what he is doing. We might have faith that a scientist knows what he is talking about when he explains the inner workings of the atom. These are all things we believe which might or might not be true (though we may have good reason to think them true). Faith in the revelation of God is very different. Unlike the historian, the doctor or the scientist, God is the One who can neither deceive nor be deceived. If, then, we accept God's revelation as being truly from Him then we need have no fear of any part of it being wrong. The truths contained within it are not relative or uncertain. They are absolute truth.

The revelation of God to us has two forms: The Bible and our Sacred Tradition. Today we reflect on the first of these, but to truly understand the first we must include the second. The bible is filled with many stories and passages which have an uncertain meaning on a first read. Some parts seem contradictory and some other parts may seem fantastical. As Catholics we always read the bible in the way which has been handed down to us, through the Church, since the time of the apostles. This does not necessarily give us all the answers, but it certainly gives us some solid guidelines.

For example, some parts of the bible are parables or stories with a meaning which are more important than whether the events described happened exactly like that. Other parts are indeed history and should be taken at face value. By using the tradition handed down to use we can work out which is which. Two cases might be the days of creation and the resurrection of Christ. In the first case, there has never been a consensus among Christians as to exactly what "days" means in the creation story. Some have said it means a twenty-four-hour period, while others have taken it to have symbolic meaning and that the time taken to create the world may have been instantaneous or taken billions of years. We are free to decide on what seems best to us. In the second case, the tradition is clear: "If Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain." That Christ literally rose from the dead is something which every orthodox Catholic has believed since it happened, and will continue to believe until the end of time.
