### **FR CHRISTIAN WRITES**

The Second Reading for this Sunday touches on one of the less understood parts of the faith today, the practice, clearly attested to here, at the earliest times, of Christian celibacy.

Christians who embrace celibacy "for the Kingdom of Heaven" do so in imitation of Christ Himself. During His earthly ministry our Lord did not marry, did not father children and did not place any particular emphasis on his family. It seems likely that this was because in previous religious movements, family had been very important. Familial descent from Abraham made one a Jew, one of God's chosen people. The leaders of the people were drawn from those descended from the first leaders. But that is not how our Lord wanted it to be. Our Lord's program of radical recreation meant that while he was born a son of Adam like the rest of us, he was also son of God and able to invite us into that sonship through baptism. "To all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the power to become children of God". This is nothing less than a new humanity and no genetic relationship is needed to be part of that.

This is also all related to the true end of all members of the new humanity, life in heaven. The blessed are transfigured into reflections of God and so "become like him, because they see him as he really is." In this state, there is no family any more. All are one in Christ. As our Lord says "For in the resurrection they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven."

Does any of this, however, mean that we are now denigrating marriage? God forbid. Marriage and family are good and holy and necessary. Indeed, so wonderful is they mystery of marriage that our Lord raised it to the level of a sacrament. It is therefore a means of grace and sanctification. Marriage is an image of the life of heaven where Christ the bridegroom forever rejoices with his bride, the Church triumphant. Meditating upon marriage like this can be particularly good for we who are discerning a call to celibacy.

Those who embrace celibacy set aside this greatest of all earthly goods. The only thing which can justify such an act of renunciation is our unswerving, hope fixed on heaven. In doing so they too become icons of the life of heaven, as married people do, but in a way, which emphasises more the final end of the Christian life.
