BAPTISMAL APPLICATION FORM

Bringing new life into the world is one of the greatest miracles of life. It brings with it many responsibilities. Over the years you will have to care for this wonderful new life and help your baby grow and become a loving and happy person, able to find joy and bring joy to the world. One of your first responsibilities as parents is to see to it that the children are baptised and receive a spiritual upbringing.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (no.1213) teaches that Holy Baptism is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit (vitae spiritualis ianua), and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. Through Baptism we are freed from sin and reborn as sons of God; we become members of Christ, are incorporated into the Church and made sharers in her mission: "Baptism is the sacrament of regeneration through water in the word".

To bring your children for Baptism is to be ready to promise to bring them up in the practice of the Catholic faith. You will be asked to make this promise during the ceremony. As well as trying to live a good Christian life yourselves, this will mean teaching your children to pray and praying with them, coming to Mass regularly each Sunday, and helping to prepare your child for the other Sacraments of Confession, Holy Communion and Confirmation when the time comes.

Parents choose a godparent (or godparents) whose role it is to provide the parents with help and support in bringing the child up as a Catholic. Ideally, both godparents should be over sixteen and Catholics (baptised, confirmed and regular at Sunday Mass), and living a good life as Catholics. A baptised person of another Christian denomination may serve as a Christian witness, but a godparent has to promise to support the Catholic upbringing of the child.

Baptisms take place by arrangement with the priest whom you will be required to meet before the baptism can be arranged. You and the godparents should be ready to attend a preparation class if so required.
