4th SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR A- 30/04/2023

ONE BY ONE HE CALLS HIS OWN SHEEP AND LEADS THEM OUT.

This verse of today's gospel struck me particularly regarding this Sunday's theme: Vocations. The original Greek literally says, 'He calls his own sheep by name and makes them exit.'

There are three fundamental aspects about the notion of vocation present in this small sentence:

- 1) He calls. A vocation is not one's own initiative at first. The voice comes from outside of one-self and it is assumed or rejected in a free way by the receiver of the call. Hence, a vocation is the fruit of a relationship with the Lord who sets you on a journey that will be a gift for you and for those you will serve.
- 2) By name. God, who presents you with this project initially not of yours, is somebody who knows you personally. God knows us by name. He knows us even better than ourselves. 'For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.' (Jr 29: 11)
- 3) To exit. To leave, to exit, to be led out of a sheepfold. Which sheepfold? Which cage? The imprisoning sheepfold of living life only for oneself.

All vocations are fundamentally grounded in the universal vocation that we all have received from God: the vocation to Love. In which way is the Good Shepherd calling us to love? Jesus said it: love one another AS I HAVE LOVED YOU. (Jn 13: 34) The Priesthood is one pathway towards fulfilling this vocation of loving all men and women with the crucified and risen love of God whose nature is total self-giving. I personally think that I am not worthy or up to this job. Nevertheless, I feel hopeful at the thought that God does not necessarily chooses those who are capable but that he equips those he chooses. I consider it would be beautifully meaningful for a man to be a sign of the fatherhood of God and to spend one's life giving what we have received from the hands of the ministers of the Church: forgiveness of sins, Words of Hope, and the Sacraments.
