THE SOURCE OF LIFE

What is the source of life for you? Where do you draw life from?

People have different opinions and experiences on these questions. Many are so busy multitasking and constantly running from one activity to another, exercising, eating, working, cooking, studying and so on, living without much time for reflection and direction in life. Many get into depression and get worn out by the demands of life which they imposed on themselves and some others who had no choice but to carry on bearing the burden of their lives. Some have given everything and have run out of energy in pursuing success in their careers, bringing up family and getting promotions at work seeking better life conditions and status. Though some may have achieved success, they still remain unsatisfied or unhappy. However, as Christians, where do we get our life from? What is the source of our lives?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1324-1327), states that, "The Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." This means that all the other sacraments and our celebrations and activities in the Church are rooted and directed to the Eucharist (*Mass*) because "in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself, our Pasch." (*Passover*)

We come to celebrate the Eucharist, to receive divine life from the Body and Blood of Christ. The Lord invites us to sit at the Eucharistic table to share in his divine life. Jesus Christ is the source of our lives. Our relationship with God is what gives us strength and renewal to our lives. We draw life from Life itself. But most importantly from the sacrament of the Body of Christ in which Christ gives himself to us and makes part of his "Mystical Body" the Church. By receiving his Blood, He gives us life. This life is the life of God which makes us one with Him by making us partakers of the Divine Life of the Holy Trinity. This mystery of the unity of love of God is our life which we can share and give it to our neighbour. We cannot go on walking on our pilgrimage of this world (*dessert*) without the "heavenly food" provide for us by the Lord. We will collapse and die if we cast out God from our lives. It is heart breaking to see that so many fellow human beings turn away from the source of life itself and have no life in themselves. On this Solemnity of the Most Precious Body and Blood of Christ, let us give thanks to God for the gift of the Eucharist, the source of our lives.

ST FRANCIS DE SALES CHURCH 128TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE LAYING OF THE FOUNDATION STONE MASS WITH BISHOP JOHN SHERRINGTON ON SUNDAY 18TH JUNE AT 11AM

On Sunday 18th June we will celebrate our 128th Anniversary of the laying of the Foundation Stone of our church of St Francis de Sales on 19th June 1895. We shall begin our celebrations on Saturday 17 June by recalling our history which started with Father Jean-Louis Lefebvre de Cheverus who founded a Mission in a chapel at No 4, Tottenham Terrace, Queen Street in 1793. Our community moved to Chapel Place (1826) and then in 1881 to Brereton Road, our present parish hall until 1895. Work started on our present church which had the Foundation Stone laid and the First Mass celebrated the same year. We shall do a short walk visiting the historical places reflecting on our history and praying on Saturday 17th June, starting from our church at 9.30am and finishing with Mass around 10.30am.

We had originally planned to celebrate the 125th Anniversary but could not do so due to Covid Restrictions at that time.
