The voke that Jesus offers us

The voke is a farming instrument, which is placed on the neck of the oxen so that they can carry out the task of tilling the land. The yoke is an instrument to be used by two animals of the same species, since each one depends on the other to be united by this instrument. The yoke was a long piece of wood with two bows that fit the neck of one or two animals; such as the ox and the mule. Two animals with the yoke on the neck form a team. The yoke has a lot of symbolism, and in literature it is used to deal with issues of oppression, slavery, domination, burden, bondage, commitments and obligations. The forms of a despotic submission in various cases of human society have much to do with the issue of vokes.


There are several types of yoke in the Bible: that of oppression and slavery (Leviticus 26:13: 1Timothy 6:1), the yoke of unbelieving (2 Corinthians 6:14), that of sin (lamentations 1:14), legalism (Acts 15:10) and finally the voke of Jesus (Matthew 11:29).

The yoke that Jesus Christ offers us to take is the yoke of his relationship with God the Father. He is yoked to the will of God and he is the one who knows the Father as the Father knows the Son. This has been revealed to us all who are like infants or as the Gospel says, mere children, that is, those who are humble. Jesus is the one who is meek and humble of heart, who pulls and works with the Father working for the salvation of his children here on earth and the whole creation.

The Lord invites you and I, to leave the yokes that oppresses us and enslaves us and drag us down to self-destruction, frustration, confusion, sadness, loneliness, depression, selfsufficiency and to take upon us the voke which Jesus Christ offers us. This voke will join us to the divine life of God himself. It promises to lighten our burdens in life and gives rest in the Lord. In other words, Jesus comes to offer us rest for our souls in heaven, with the Lord. If we make this choice to work with the Lord, we can do so much more for the salvation of our lives and the lives of so many people who need to receive life from the Lord through our lives.

'Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. Yes, my yoke is easy and my burden light.'
