The Anawim

Anawim (pronounced ann-a-weem) is a Hebrew word from the Old Testament which describes the "poor ones" who remained faithful to God in times of difficulty. These humble people became known as the anawim or the "faithful remnant."

St John Paul II, teaches that the anawim, "the poor and lowly ones" are not just the oppressed, the miserable, the persecuted for justice, but also those who, with fidelity to the moral teaching of the Covenant with God, are marginalized by those who prefer to use violence, riches and power. In this light one understands that the category of the "poor" is not just a social category but a spiritual choice. It is what the famous first Beatitude means: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5,3). The prophet Zephaniah spoke to the anawim as special persons: "Seek the Lord, all you humble of the land, who do his commands; seek righteousness, seek humility; perhaps you may be hidden on the day of wrath of the Lord" (Zep 2,3).

These are the people whom Jesus in today's Gospels refers to as the poor ones, that is, 'the prostitutes and tax collectors' who have listened and converted from their evil ways to following Jesus, in contrast to the prideful and not listening attitude of 'the chief priests and elders of the people'.

The tax collectors and prostitutes are the people who have the attitude of the anawim, since they seek God in humility and convert to do God's will (the father in the parable) because they believed in the love of God (*hesed*) who forgives their sins and accepts them into his family.

Now the Church asks us: Do we have the spirit of the anawim or do we remain attached to our prideful attitude like the chief priests and elders?

This week, let us pray to Jesus and asked him to grant us the spirit of the anawim by praying and contemplating Jesus's humility and love for us, described in the Christian hymn of St Paul to the Philippians 2:6-11.
