Teaching and living the Gospel

In this Sunday's Gospel Jesus fires heavily on the Pharisees who are the teachers of the Law in Israel. He is very critical of their hypocrisy and lack of coherent behaviour as teachers of the Law. They are criticised for not living what they preach. They talk the talk but do not walk the walk! It is evident in the Gospels that the Pharisees are critical opponents of Jesus, of his teaching and mission. The Pharisees were a group of religious leaders who were deeply concern about the cultural and religious crisis caused by the Roman occupation. The name Pharisee (Hebrew perushim) means "separated ones." They believe that Israel must separate itself from all Gentile impurity and defilement, since only in this way will God rescue his people from the power of Rome. They did this in a practical way by giving a considerably high attention to ritual purity guided by the Old Testament Law and developed an entire body of personal ritual and traditions to stand alongside the Law of Moses (613 ritual prescriptions). They were respected people among the Jewish society and had a very good intention to protect their traditions and identity as a reaction to the influence of the conquering power and its culture and religion. However, their overzeal to preserve the purity of the Law and identity, led them to forget the essence of the Law which is, Love for God and neighbour as yourself. In this sense, the prophet's Malachi's words concur with Jesus' reproach to them when it says, 'you have strayed from the way; you have caused many to stumble by your teaching.'

By contrast St Paul has become another kind of teacher who has converted and learnt the way Jesus has taught him to be a teacher and preacher of the Gospel. The lines he wrote to his converts of the Thessalonian community speaks volumes of his character when he wrote, 'Like a mother feeding and looking after her own children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you, and had come to love you so much, that we were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well.' St Paul was educated as a Pharisee in the school of a famous Rabbi called Gamaliel and he converted after his meeting with Jesus on his way to Damascus. There were many Pharisees like St Paul who believed in Jesus and became followers of Jesus. St Paul's life became like Jesus'. St Paul became the teacher whose life was a living Gospel. His preaching and teaching were accepted with the authority of Jesus as God himself. He had given his life for the Gospel, and this was evident to all his converts as his life was coherent with his teaching and this has given him that authority which the other Pharisees lacked. On this week, let us ask the Lord to help us to look at our lives and not to be afraid to question ourselves and see if our lives are coherent with our faith and accept to convert to the Lord and let him teach us and mould us to become true teachers of the Gospel.
