

Silence and Memory

Today is Remembrance Sunday, the British Legion Charity describes it as "a national opportunity to remember the service and sacrifice of all those that have defended our freedom and protected our way of life". On this Remembrance Sunday each year we stop everything to make 2-minutes silence in our busy lives. At 11am the whole country comes to a standstill to contemplate and remember, in a moment of prayer, all those who have fallen in the last two world wars and pray in gratitude to them and their families for their sacrifice for freedom and peace we enjoy today.

On this month of November, the Church invites us to remember and pray for our departed loved ones. We do this by making silence before the Lord as we bring back the memories of our loved ones, our grandparents, parents, brothers and sisters, children, spouses, friends, teachers, colleagues and everyone who have been part of our lives. Silence allows us to enter into our own personal history of life and contemplate it in the light of the events, deeds, words and love we have received from our loved ones and other people who we did not know personally that have shaped us and made us the persons we are today. It is not only important to make memories of our identity, but it is crucial to do this regularly, to never forget who we are and to keep walking in the right direction in our lives. A man and a woman without history becomes inexistence. We do not want this to happen to us or anyone of our beloved departed ones. Today we make silence and remember all the victims of the last two world wars and our loved ones. Their lives and sacrifices have a great value to us and our world. Their names cannot be forgotten, if we did, we would be denying our history and their words, deeds and sacrifices they made for us. Whenever we celebrate the Mass, we make a "memorial" of the sacrifice of Jesus for us. This is not a mere memory but a memorial of the act of salvation the Lord made for us to set us free from death itself. How can we not remember this great sign of the love of God has for us! We celebrate this love with gratitude at every Mass.

The memories we recall this Remembrance Sunday should spur us to keep working towards building up ways of peace and harmony starting from our family relationships and then extending it to the wider community and our society. As the Lord commanded the apostles to "Do this in memory of me" we gather this day praying that the graces of the sacrifice of the Lord on the cross may bring true peace, love and freedom to our trouble world, especially in Israel, Gaza and Ukraine; and to our fallen we say, "We will remember them".

They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old:

Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.

At the going down of the sun and in the morning. We will remember them.
