

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE YEAR A- 26/11/2023

CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

The Church's liturgical year concludes with this feast of Christ the King, instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 to celebrate the Jubilee Year and the 16th centenary of the Council of Nicaea. Instituting this feast, Pope Pius XI proclaimed: "Pax Christi in regno Christi" ("The peace of Christ in the reign of Christ"). This great feast was established and proclaimed by the Pope to reassert the sovereignty of Christ over all earthly powers and remind us Christians, of our identity as children of God and heirs of the Kingdom of Heaven. This feast comes to assure us that Christ is present reigning in our lives in our troubled world. It proclaims that He has already been victorious over death, since he has risen from the dead and, has given us the gift of eternal life. We Christians believe that God reigns over everything and has power to overcome all evils and sufferings humanity causes to each other by waging war and exploiting the poor and vulnerable. God reigns over all other "apparent powerful gods" of our materialistic and secularised world, driven by the lust of money and power that is causing us today to live in fear and anxiety. Today's feast invites us to have faith and hope in our Lord Jesus Christ and let Christ reign in us and through us so that we. like him, may serve our neighbours as Christ taught us, to work for the Kingdom of God. However, some may ask, what is the Kingdom of God and where is that kingdom of Christ on earth? Here is an explanation given by Gerald Darring (St. Louis University: Center for Liturgy): The Kingdom of God is a space. It exists in every home where parents and children love each other. It exists in every region and country that cares for its weak and vulnerable. It exists in every parish that reaches out to the needy. The Kingdom of God is a time. It happens whenever someone feeds a hungry person, or shelters a homeless person, or shows care to a neglected person. It happens whenever we overturn an unjust law, or correct an injustice, or avert a war. It happens whenever people join in the struggle to overcome poverty, to erase ignorance, to pass on the Faith. The Kingdom of God is in the past (in the life and work of Jesus of Nazareth); it is in the present (in the work of the Church and in the efforts of many others to create a world of goodness and justice); it is in the future (reaching its completion in the age to come). The Kingdom of God is a condition. Its symptoms are love, justice, and peace. Jesus Christ is King! We pray today that God may help us to recognise his powerful hand acting in our world and lives and to reign with him by serving God in our neighbours, as Christ the Servant King served humanity by his sacrifice on the Cross and redeemed us in his Resurrection.
