

WE HAVE BEEN MADE CHILDREN OF GOD

During the season of Christmas, we have been celebrating the Self-revelation of God through Jesus. Christmas is the feast of God's Self-revelation to the Jews, and the Epiphany of the Lord celebrates God's Self-revelation to the Gentiles. On Monday we celebrated the feast of the Baptism of the Lord which mark the beginning of his public ministry but also the revelation to humankind of the Mystery of God which the Church calls the dogma of the Holy Trinity, God being the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The presence of the Trinity reveals Jesus' identity and mission and consequently, ours as God's children. The heaven's opening indicates God's intervention in our human history. God is not indifferent to our human condition and comes down to us in the person of Jesus to let us know that we are his children and that we are loved in the "Beloved Son." This is the Good News (Gospel). You and I are the beloved ones of God our Father. He has given us Jesus to make us his adoptive children through baptism. John gave a baptism of repentance but Jesus the Christ, the sinless who had no need to repent from any sin, was there shoulder to shoulder with repentant sinners waiting to receive the baptism of John at the start of his public ministry. He shows us that we are not alone, that God is not far away from us, but he is here among us sharing in our frailty and weaknesses and he comes down to enter into the muddy waters of our lives. He came to wash away our sins and gives us the Holy Spirit to make of us "adopted children of God." The waters of baptism have been made holy by the Holy one of God. By Baptism we become the adoptive sons and daughters of God, brothers and sisters of Jesus, members of his Church, heirs of Heaven and temples of the Holy Spirit. We become incorporated into the Church, the Body of Christ, and made sharers in the priesthood of Christ [CCC #1279]. The mission of Jesus, the Christ was to save us from sin. The prophecy of Isaiah 42 applies to Jesus, he is "the servant of God" who has been baptised in "blood" by his passion and death. Jesus was aware of his mission and embraced it for love of us all.

Today let us renew our baptismal promises as Catholic Christians and children of God. Let us pray and give thanks to God for the gift of having been made children of God and coheirs of the promise of life eternal through Jesus Christ. Let us pray with grateful hearts for our parents and godparents and all those who have been feeding our faith in God throughout our lives. May God help us to listen to his voice as Samuel and Jesus did and be able to say with them 'here I am Lord! I come to do your will' Let us ask the Lord to make us able to do his will and fulfil our mission as dignified chosen children of God. May we be true disciples of Christ and bring our brothers and sisters before the Lord as Simon brought his brother Simon who became Peter. Let us be God's presence among our neighbours by serving them with patience, care and love.
