

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Let us enter into the desert with Jesus Christ

We have started the holy season of Lent with the celebration of Ash Wednesday by receiving the ashes on our heads as the sign of our human frailty and the call to conversion towards God. As every year on this First Sunday of Lent, the Church invites us to unite ourselves to the mystery of Jesus who is led into the desert (CCC 540), to be tempted by Satan (the Accuser) who tries to compromise his filial love for God and divert him from his mission to save us all by his passion and death on the cross, as it was the will of God the Father who sent him (cf. Jn 6:38). The temptation of Jesus in the desert for forty days and forty nights, is a recapitulation of Israel's temptations in the desert, where they wandered for forty years. Where Israel failed to obey God, Jesus has triumphed through humble obedience to the will of the Father. Israel's disobedience also echoes that of Adam and Eve in the garden of Eden. The imagery of the wild beasts in the desert also echoes that of the serpent in the garden of Eden. 'Jesus' victory over the tempter in the desert anticipates victory at the Passion, the supreme act of obedience of his filial love for the Father' (CCC 539). As we enter the mystery of the spiritual desert for the next forty days and nights, we get ready to face a spiritual battle against the temptations from the enemy, not on our own but with Jesus Christ's grace. Many of us has already been experiencing the desert in many ways! Many have experienced and are experiencing the feeling of abandonment from God in their struggles with accumulated debts, broken relationships and illnesses, perhaps some are dealing with mental and physical illness or being stuck in depression and bereaving loved ones. Let us remember that the Lord Jesus has already overcome the temptation to renounce to faith and believe that there is no God, as if our Father were absent from our lives. The evil one, will always tried to convince us of this lie. However, we believe that our God is near us and walks with us. Jesus knows well our weaknesses and frailty, as the letter to the Hebrews says, "For we have not a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning." (Hb 4:15). It is greatly comforting to read in today's gospel that the angels were ministering Jesus in the desert. The Lord has and will send angels to help us out, in our struggles in our desert, that person who calls, that neighbour who helps to get food, that person who is ready to listen and give support, that person who is kind and is ready to seek help on my behalf. We are surrounded by angels! You are one! We live in hope and faith waiting for the Lord, to show his loving kindness and faithfulness in the desert, to make us pass-over from our sufferings to rest in him in the promise land, that is, heaven.
