Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

When Jesus began to speak to crowds of people he used everyday images to get his message across. There was the shepherd looking after his flock of sheep and goats, the vinedresser pruning the grapevines, the fishermen bringing in a great catch and, in today's Gospel, the sower sowing seed in his field. He uses parables of nature to help us concentrate on what are simple stories which have in fact deep meanings. He helps us to understand the hidden meanings. Even if we are provided with a good grounding in the faith, we sometimes drift away. We need to remind ourselves that Our Lord is always our companion on the road and will always guide us back to the right path. He uses us and his chosen ones to do the guiding.

A few months ago we had a parish mission. My hope was that this would revive each one of us and help us to re-dedicate ourselves so that we can bring others face to face with Our Lord, by the things we say, by the things we do, by the example we set. Our Mission reflected very much the message of Pope Francis when he wrote that special letter entitled the Joy of the Gospel in which he spoke about the family of the Church and the special local family, the parish. Our parish family of Tring is part of the wider Church but it is within our local community that we usually experience what it is to be a Catholic.

As a community, we come together, especially at Sunday Mass, with our joys and sorrows, our strengths and weaknesses, our special gifts and talents, our abilities, our special experiences and skills. We do not all have the same particular gifts, talents and skills. We are not all good at coping with children and young people, meeting the needs of those in old age, assisting those who are housebound. We all have at least one skill, one gift, one talent that can help build up our parish community. On a number of occasions I have asked you to consider what particular skill you might have that will help build up our parish. Today I have identified eight ministries and activities which might be just right for you: You can probably think of others.

1. Liturgical Ministries: adult servers to lead and train younger servers, reading God's Word at weekly or daily mass, special ministers of the Eucharist, part of the team who lead the children's Liturgy on Sundays, ministers of the Liturgical environment such as sacristans to help Wendy, Frances and Annabelle and flower arrangers to help our present team of Margaret, Joan and Heather and singers to form an adult and junior choir, musicians and musicians in training to play the organ or form musical groups of adults and children.

2. Catechetical Ministries: Sharing our faith with children who are preparing for the sacraments of confirmation, first confession and first communion, adults to be trained as catechists for the first communion and confirmation programmes, for the increasing number of children attending non Catholic schools, communion, to support people thinking of becoming Catholics, to give spiritual and practical help to people planning to get married, to help people preparing for the baptism of their children.

3. Youth Ministry: to assist Dan Marsh, our Youth Worker, and Tricia Apps in organising SPOG and our youth clubs and other activities concerning young people who will be the Church of Tomorrow.

4. Life-Long Parish Ministries: to give support to couples who are experiencing difficulties in their marriage, in caring for children with special needs and elderly parents who can no longer manage on their own, visiting and sick and housebound and all who are in need.

5. The Social life of the Parish: arranging social events, dances, quizzes and many other ways to bring people together for social entertainment.

6. Our local community in Tring: links with local church communities such as Churches Together, the Meditation Group and the Bible Society and with other social, cultural and historical communities.

7. The wider Church: Supporting CAFOD, the Apostleship of the Sea, Caritas Westminster, the Catholic Children's Society, Justice and Peace and many diocesan and universal Church activities.


8. A parish pastoral council that would help bring together and co-ordinate everything that is happening in our parish.

There are a number of groups which may help us to grow in our faith: the Ascent Group which brings the over-fifties together for prayer, reflection and food; The Marriage Course which is an umbrella group which helps parishes to become more open and welcoming, which brings couples together (Catholic and non Catholic), for house groups and prayer groups, which provides marriage preparation courses, parenting children courses and parenting teenagers courses.

St Paul was a great evangelizer, someone who shared the Good News of the Gospel with as many people as possible. He would have relished being able to use the means of communication that we have today, radio, television, the press, the social media like Facebook and Twitter. Our Holy Father Francis is doing what Paul would have loved to do, sharing his thoughts with us such as recent blogs of Pope Francis: It is not enough to say we are Christians. We must live the faith, not only with our words, but with our actions. To live as true children of God means to love our neighbour and those close to us who are lonely and in difficulty. We might also remember the words of St Teresa of Avila: God has no hands but yours, no feet but yours. I shall print the full text next week.

Finally I ask you to complete the questionnaire issued with this newsletter and offer yourselves to fulfil one or more of the ministries and activities listed.
