

## *Letter from Langdon Street*

My dear people

Today we celebrate Christ as our King. The Scriptures remind us of the values of love and compassion in God's kingdom and how Our Lord will judge us. They also help us understand what kind of king Jesus is and what it means for us to belong to his kingdom.

When Pope Pius XI introduced the feast in 1925, the world was still recovering from the horrors of World War I. The great empires of Austria-Hungary, Germany, Russia and Turkey had been destroyed. Hardly the ideal time to talk about kingdoms and empires. The Pope wanted to remind us of the Kingdom of Christ, which Jesus himself told us "was not of this world."

The Prophet Ezekiel tells us that the kings and rulers of his time had proved unwilling to govern by God's principles and so the Lord himself would come to lead us. He did not want people with power to "lord it over others" but rather be of service. The Gospel fills this out when we are told to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit those in prison and take care of the sick – the works of mercy. During the past week Pope Francis attended a conference in Rome in Rome organised by the UN Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) at its Headquarters in Rome on Thursday to give a speech to the Second International Conference on Nutrition. He spoke of waste and excessive consumption of food as well as the rights of those who go hungry.

The people in this country respond generously to so many appeals for help for those in need. We support efforts to protect the environment and conserve our natural resources. We support peace groups to try to prevent war. World Aids Day is coming up to remind of many people in developing countries suffering from HIV/Aids. We must also find ways to support prisoners and their families.

Pope Francis talks about us as members of a parish, He says that we are "an evangelizing community that gets involved by word and deed in people's daily lives; it bridges distances, it is willing to abase itself if necessary, and it embraces human life, touching the suffering flesh of Christ in others. Evangelizers thus take on the "smell of the sheep" and the sheep are willing to hear their voice.

The Preface for today's Eucharistic Prayer talks about the kingdom that Our Lord came on earth to establish: "a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, a kingdom of justice, love, and peace." Those who respect truth and life, who live in holiness and grace, and who work to bring justice, love and peace, will "inherit the kingdom prepared for them from the creation of the world."

As the Liturgical Year comes to an end with the Feast of Christ the King we are reminded of the words that Jesus spoke in today's Gospel: "Come, you whom my Father has blessed. Take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world."
