Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

Fifty years ago the Second Vatican Council came to an end. One of its messages to us was to remind us of Our Lord's command to go out and make disciples of all nations. The Council put the whole Church onto a missionary footing. A few years ago Pope Benedict XVI reminded us of this when he set up a new office in Rome for what he called the New Evangelisation. Pope Francis grasped this with both hands when he was an archbishop in Argentina. One of his first messages as pope, known in Latin as *Evangelii Gaudium*, spoke even more strongly that Pope Benedict that the call to mission is 'central' to 'all that we are and all that we want to do.' The Vatican Council said this. Blessed Paul VI said this. Saint John Paul II said this. Pope Benedict said this. Pope Francis is saying this. Last weekend there was a conference in Birmingham entitled ***Proclaim 15***. Cardinal Nichols gave the same Message. The apostles were given a mandate to preach the Gospel. We have been given the same mandate to carry out the same mission. We received it when we were baptised. Pope Francis calls us missionary disciples.

How do we carry out this mission? We first have to reaffirm our place in the Church which is a community. Vatican II introduced us to the word "communio" which means communion or fellowship as well as community. It is used to describe the relationship in the Holy Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is used to describe the Church as a community of believers who share the life of the Holy Trinity. Our Lord told us that he came into our world that we might have life to the full. This is the life we call grace, the life of God himself. Through this we are drawn together as God's family, the Church. We are more than a group of like-minded people who have agreed a programme of action. We are participants in the mystery of the Godhead. Everything about the Church flows from this union. Everything about our parish flows from it too. It is what comes from God that holds us together. Cardinal Nichols tells us: "Our striving after that sharing of life, of love, of truth, of goodness, of beauty which flows from God is the only thing that makes sense of parish life. That is why the celebration of Mass is our central act; why we say that the Eucharist makes the Church. This is why our life of prayer is essential; why our pondering of the Scriptures is crucial; why our gazing on Our Lord present in the Blessed Sacrament is our silent centre."

As we gather at mass today we are in the presence of the Lord. We are here to listen to his word in the Scriptures. We are drawn into the ministry of Jesus, the true shepherd of God's people. Jesus saw the multitudes as like sheep without a shepherd. His mission was to bring them to fresh pastures near restful waters. He sent the apostles to find the lost sheep. In our day we are being sent to do the same. First to those who are no longer with us, the so-called "resting Catholics" who come occasionally or have given up on us altogether. We have to welcome them back. We must also reach out to those who belong to no church community. We must tell them the good news about Jesus, the Good Shepherd.
