### *Letter from Langdon Street*

My dear people

A few days ago I was reading about a priest in Sicily called Giuseppe Puglisi. He was born in the same year as me. He grew up in modest circumstances. His father was a shoemaker and his mother was a dressmaker. He entered the seminary and was ordained a priest in 1960. After serving as a curate in several parishes he was made parish priest of the district where he had grown up. He upset some of the local people. He knew the place had serious social and spiritual problems and that the local authorities and police were dominated by the power of the local Mafia. He set about teaching the street children, he refused to allow the Mafia to take places of honour in the processions and mobilised parishioners to fight against the corruption that the authorities were turning a blind eye to. It was easy for people to turn a blind eye and excuse themselves by saying that nothing can be done. One of his favourite sayings was: "If everyone does something, then we can do a lot." On his fifty-sixth birthday he was shot dead by a hired gunman. Twenty years later fifty thousand people gathered in Palermo to celebrate his beatification.

When Our Lord returned to his home town of Nazareth he upset some of the local people. He had grown up in the village but did not stand out as someone special. For them his father was just the local carpenter. His return is described in today's Gospel. He challenged the people and upset them so much that they drove him out of town and tried to kill him.

Like Father Puglisi Our Lord put himself in danger not just in Nazareth but also in Jerusalem and other places too. He was doing what other prophets had done before him. Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Elijah and others right down to John the Baptist all put their lives at risk. That's what prophets have to do. It is part of their job description. Our Lord described his own circumstances when he said that a prophet is never recognised in his own country.

In today's mass we are reminded that the prophetic vocation is an integral part of our Christian faith. It speaks God's truth to us. We may not be happy about this. It may disturb us. We may prefer a problem to go away. I can remember Bishop O'Brien talking about a journey he made to San Salvador after Archbishop Oscar Romero was assassinated while saying mass. He and other bishops had to take refuge behind the altar when shots were fired during the Archbishop's funeral mass. The Archbishop was recently beatified, a martyr who had spoken out on behalf of the poor people of his diocese.

The prophet Ezekiel spoke about his critics: "Whether they listen or not, this set of rebels shall know there is a prophet among them." There are bishops, priests and laypeople in Iraq, Syria, Libya and elsewhere who are speaking out as prophets in our own time, facing injury and death by people who are distorting their own faith to justify what they are doing. Despite

the plight of our fellow Catholics who are suffering so this "set of rebels" seem to be killing more of their own people and there appears to be no one able to speak out against them
