Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

I like the story of a little girl at a school in Florida who paused to say Grace before her lunch in the school canteen. She was reprimanded by the school meal supervisor who was told to get in with eating her meal. She replied by saying: "It is good to pray" but the supervisor rejected this and told to her to eat her meal. The parents were outraged because they had school. They felt that in offering thanks to God before meals they were showing that they did not take their food and their lives for granted. They were also teaching their daughter to develop an understanding of herself as a human being placed in a world of gifts from God.

The school meal supervisor wanted to get all the children fed and out of the canteen as soon as possible. Maybe there was a second sitting with another group of children waiting for lunch. That was her priority. The parents and their daughter had different priorities. In the midst of the whirl and speed of life today they saw the importance of the short pause in life to say the Grace helped them to focus on what really matters. Eating is not simply a physical act. It is also a spiritual occasion whereby the deep and sacramental significance of life is learnt daily.

In today's Gospel Our Lord uses the staple food of bread to point his followers, and us, to do something important. He was not just giving the crowd a free lunch. He was offering them not just the bread, which was a staple food for them, but something more important, himself. He tells them that he is the "bread of life" and this was essential for them not just in this life but in the life to come. He is not just proving them with food for their bodies but also food that feeds them spiritually with love, hope, forgiveness and the life of grace.

God is the source of all life. In the desert he gave the people manna, food from heaven. George Herbert, one of the great poets of the 17th century wrote the following:


**Love bade me welcome, yet my soul drew back, guilty of dust and sin.
But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack from my first entrance in,
Drew near to me, sweetly questioning if I lack'd anything.**

**"A guest," I answer'd, "worthy to be here." Love said, "you shall be he."
"I, the unkind, the ungrateful? Ah, my dear, I cannot look on thee."
Love took my hand and smiling did reply, "Who made the eyes but I?"**

**"Truth, Lord; but I have marr'd them; let my shame go where it doth deserve."
"And know you not," says Love, "Who bore blame?" "My dear, then I will serve."
"You must sit down," says Love, "and taste my meat." So I did sit and eat."**

I never cease to be amazed at the number of cookery programmes that we can see on television. The great recipes that are offered to us are nothing like what Our Lord offers us. He says to us: "Do not work for food that perishes but for the food that endures for eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you." St Paul today explains that the Christian way of life is a fundamentally changed life requiring a change of lifestyle.
