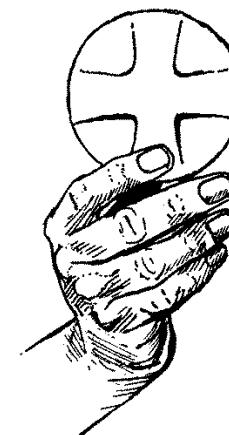

Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

At mass today all three readings tell us to stop grumbling. First of all we hear the prophet Elijah complaining to God that everything was just too much for him. He just wanted to lie down and die. He had done everything he could to call the people back to God but it had all been in vain. God did something special. He gave him enough food and drink to strengthen him for the long journey to Mount Horeb. St Paul in today's epistle encourages to avoid bad behaviour and also to stop grumbling. Finally, Our Lord tells the people to stop complaining and to look for real food which he describes as the living bread that guarantees eternal life.

The background to the first reading today is that Elijah has just slain all the prophets of Baal, a false god, and now is running away from the fury of Jezebel, the notorious wife of Ahab, the king of northern Israel. Ahab was weak and Jezebel strong. Elijah knows that he is in trouble! No wonder he was in despair. Yet he did what he was told and after being fed was able to walk to Mount Horeb. Jezebel would soon get her comeuppance and Elijah would pass on his mission to his disciple Elisha and disappear in a fiery chariot.

In the Gospel today Our Lord invites us to believe in him so that we may enjoy life forever with him at the heavenly banquet where we will be free from worries, disappointments, tribulations and all the sorrows we experience in this life. Elijah was fortified by what God offered him and this enabled him to complete his journey. Our Lord fortifies us with what Our Lord offers us which sustains us on our journey through this life. We are pilgrims on earth and the journey is sometimes long.

At mass the reading from the Old Testament is often a backdrop to the Gospel. This is certainly so today. The middle reading, usual from one of St Paul's epistles is often ignored. Most of the speeches recorded in the Acts of the Apostles are actually sermons that he preached when he was celebrating mass with a local community. Those sermons often came down to a final message telling the people how to live their daily lives fortified by what they have received. Today's epistle is the same. St Paul tells us not to grieve the Holy Spirit by our bad behaviour. We have been sealed with the Holy Spirit, sealed for the day of redemption. It is no use being filled with the grace of the Eucharist if we then go home to be bitter, unpleasant and malicious. St Paul tells us to be "kind to one another, compassionate, forgiving one another as God has forgiven you in Christ. So be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and handed himself over for us as a sacrificial offering to God for a fragrant aroma."

The consequence of being "sealed with the Holy Spirit" is that we are marked out as totally belonging to Our Lord. We are enrolled in his service. We are called to be holy as God is Holy. We must put aside worldly ways. We are called to a better life, to be gentle and kind to one another, affectionate, tender-hearted, and forgiving as God has forgiven us. These are the qualities of the children of God.
