Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

I have just got back from two weeks in Italy where the weather was wonderful. It had not rained for ten weeks until a week ago and we had two inches of rain in twenty four hours. My journey back through France was accompanied by wind and rain. On Wednesday I arrived in Calais and it was really sad to see the new fences put up around the Channel Tunnel entrance and even worse to see make-shift camp sites in different parts of Calais. Pope Francis has made appeals on several occasions and challenged us to be generous in supporting people who have been forced to flee their homes. Cardinal Nichols issued an appeal on our behalf to urge the government to respond to the crisis and provide assistance for these desperate people who are refugees who have fled for their lives, not economic migrants who are merely seeking a better way of life. There is a notice at the back of church about a group of local people who want to take emergency supplies to the refugees in Calais. Please help in every way you can.

Last Sunday we had an appeal for the Xaverian Foreign Mission Society and you generously contributed £562.40 to their work.

Today is Home Mission Sunday when we are asked to support the work of evangelisation in our own country. It is celebrated each year in September and its theme this year, inspired by Pope Francis, is PROCLAIM GOD'S MERCY. We are encouraged today to pray for the work of evangelisation in England and Wales, especially for those people who are distant from the life of faith. We are also asked to support the work financially. There will be a second collection at mass today. You may also contribute on line at www.catholicnews.org.uk/donations.

Bishop Mark O'Toole, Bishop of Plymouth, is Chairman of the Bishops' Department for Evangelisation and Catechesis, has written the following message to us: "Pope Francis has written recently: "May the balm of mercy reach everyone, both believers and those far away, as a sign that the Kingdom of God is already present in our midst. The Church is commissioned to announce the mercy of God, the bearing heart of the Gospel, which in its own way must penetrate the heart and mind of every person." The bishops of England and Wales have this year chosen two themes for Home Mission Sunday – proclaim and God's mercy. **Proclaim:** That as a fruit of prayer every Catholic and every parish will take a new step to share their faith more joyfully and confidently, and so build missionary parishes. **God's Mercy:** That Catholic individuals and parishes will consider afresh how they will present "the balm of God's mercy" to others, in response to Pope Francis' announcement that there will be a Jubilee Year of Mercy, starting in December.

Research suggests that the majority of baptised Catholics rarely have contact with their local parish. Further, that the number of people who identify themselves as having "no religion" is on the rise. Please help us to develop new resources and strategies to reach out to people with the message of God's unconditional love and mercy."

ASSISTED SUICIDE

On Friday 11th September the House of Commons debated and voted on a Bill to legalise assisted suicide. The Members of Parliament on both sides of the argument discussed the whole issue and 72 per cent of those who voted rejected the Bill. They recognised that the Bill would put the most vulnerable people in our society at risk. Cardinal Nichols and Archbishop Smith have expressed the thanks of all the bishops for the response of ordinary parishioners to their appeal for them to contact their local member of parliament. It just shows that if we put our minds to it, we can influence discussions in parliament and even persuade government ministers to change their minds.
