Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

The picture on the cover of this week's newsletter is the official logo of the Jubilee Year of Mercy which begins in a week's time, on Tuesday 8 December, the feast of the Immaculate Conception. This date is also the fiftieth anniversary on the closing of the Second Vatican Council. It was to mark this event that Pope Francis decided to declare a holy year. The motto of the Year of Mercy is "Merciful like the Father." Sometimes, when we think of the word *mercy*, we picture someone throwing themselves on their knees before a cruel villain, pleading to be spared some punishment. This is not our understanding of God's mercy. We do not ask for God's mercy because we are afraid of incurring his wrath as punishment for our sins. Rather, when we call on God to have mercy, we are calling on God in the only way we know him—as one who responds with compassion to those in need. When we show mercy to others, we are responding as God responds, with compassion.

Pope Francis recently spoke about the parable of the Merciful Father, the one we normally call the parable of the Prodigal Son. He said: "I am always struck by this parable. It impresses me because it always gives me great hope. Think of that younger son who was in the father's house, who was loved; and yet he wants his part of the inheritance. He goes off, spends everything, hits rock bottom, where he could not be more distant from the father. Yet when he is at his lowest, he misses the warmth of the father's house and he goes back. And the father? Had he forgotten the son? No, never. He is there, he sees the son from afar; he was waiting for him every hour of every day. The son was always in his father's heart, even though he had left him, even though he had squandered his whole inheritance, his freedom. The father, with patience, love, hope, and mercy had never for a second stopped thinking about him, and as soon as he sees him still far off, he runs out to meet him and embraces him with tenderness, the tenderness of God, without a word of reproach: his son has returned! And that is the joy of the father. In that embrace for his son is all this joy: he has returned!"

God's love for us is revealed not just as love but also of mercy and compassion. Those of you who are of my generation will remember having to learn the catechism off by heart. One group I remember is what we call the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. These are actions that we can perform to extend God's mercy and compassion to those in need. The Corporal Works are those kindly acts by which we help our neighbours in their material and physical needs. The Spiritual Works are acts of compassion by which we help our neighbours with their emotional and spiritual needs.

The Corporal Works of Mercy are to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, shelter the homeless, visit the sick, visit the imprisoned and bury the dead. The Spiritual Works of Mercy are to counsel the doubtful, instruct the ignorant, admonish sinners, comfort the afflicted, forgive offenses, bear wrongs patiently and pray for the living and the dead.

Pope Francis hopes that the Jubilee Year of Mercy will be for all believers a true moment of encounter with the mercy of God and a living experience of the closeness of the Father.
