Letter from Langdon Street

My dear people

When Pope Francis opened the Year of Mercy last December he told us that “the Church is commissioned to announce the mercy of God, the beating heart of the Gospel, which in its way must penetrate the heart and mind of every person.” He asked also that “the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year be lived more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God’s mercy.” Lent is upon us in just three days time. Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. There is mass at 10.00 am and 7.30 pm. Ashes will be blessed and distributed at both masses.

In the Old Testament we are constantly told of the covenant that God made with his chosen people, the Children of Israel. This covenant was a special promise made between God and Israel. It was a love story in which God, ever merciful and forgiving, played the role of betrayed husband while Israel played the role of an unfaithful bride. The prophet Hosea described how time and time again, Israel was unfaithful but God was always ready to forgive.


Pope Francis tells us that mercy expresses God’s way of reaching out to the sinner, offering us a new chance to look at ourselves, to convert, and believe. In this way God restores his relationship with us. In his crucified son He shows his desire to draw near to sinners, however far they may have strayed from him.

As a man, Jesus of Nazareth is a true son of Israel. Every Sabbath he would have recited the Shema, which Jewish people still recite today. This prayer is the heart of God’s covenant with Israel: “Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might.” As the Son of God, Jesus is the bridegroom who does everything to win over the love of his bride, the Church, to whom he is bound by an unconditional love which becomes visible in the eternal wedding feast of heaven but which expressed now and every time we celebrate mass together.

Pope Francis tells us: “God’s mercy transforms human hearts; it enables us, through the experience of a faithful love, to become merciful in turn. In an ever new miracle, divine mercy shines forth in our lives, inspiring each of us to love our neighbour and to devote ourselves to what the Church’s tradition calls the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. These works remind us that faith finds expression in concrete everyday actions meant to help our neighbours in body and spirit: by feeding, visiting, comforting and instructing them. On such things will we be judged. For this reason, I express my hope that the Christian people may reflect on the corporal and spiritual works of mercy; this will be a way to reawaken our conscience, too often grown dull in the face of poverty, and to enter more deeply into the heart of the Gospel where the poor have a special experience of God’s mercy.”

For us, then, members of the parish family of Corpus Christi, the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favourable time. Pope Francis wants us to make it extra special. It would be good for us to begin thinking about what we might do this Lent. The traditional “tools” offered us by the Church are prayer, fasting and almsgiving.
