## *Letter from Langdon Street*

My dear people

In October 1979 St John Paul II visited the United States and one of his visits was to the people of Harlem in New York. In the course of his address to the African Americans he quoted words from St Augustine about us being an "Easter People." This is part of what he said:

I come to you as a servant of Jesus Christ, and I want to speak to you about him. Christ came to bring joy: joy to children, joy to parents, joy to families and to friends, joy to workers and to scholars, joy to the sick and to the elderly, joy to all humanity.

In a true sense, joy is the keynote of the Christian message and the recurring motif of the Gospels. Recall the first words of the angel to Mary: "Rejoice, O full of grace, the Lord is with you" (*Lk* 1: 28). And at the birth of Jesus, the angels announced to the shepherds: "Listen, I bring you news of great joy, joy to be shared by all people" (*Lk* 2: 10). Years later as Jesus entered Jerusalem riding on a colt, "the whole group of disciples joyfully began to praise God at the top of their voices: 'Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord' !" (*Lk* 19: 37-38) . We are told that some Pharisees in the crowd complained, saying: "Master, stop your disciples". But Jesus answered: "I tell you, if they were silent, the very stones would cry out" (*Lk* 19 :39-40).


Are not those words of Jesus still true today? If we are silent about the joy that comes from knowing Jesus, the very stones of our cities will cry out ! For we are an Easter people and "Alleluia" is our song. With Saint Paul I exhort you: "Rejoice in the Lord always, I say it again, rejoice" (*Phil* 4:4). Rejoice because Jesus has come into the world!

Rejoice because Jesus has died upon the Cross! Rejoice because he rose again from the dead! Rejoice because in baptism, he washed away our sins! Rejoice because Jesus has come to set us free! And rejoice because he is the . master of our life!

These words provide a good foundation for us as we come together to celebrate Our Lord's resurrection. The life of our risen Lord is for everyone. St Peter tells us in our first reading that God does not have favourites. St Paul's Epistle tells us that through baptism we have died with Christ and entered into the life of the resurrection.

Good Friday had ended in terrible darkness for the apostles and for Our Lady. During Holy Saturday St Peter went around Jerusalem rounding up the apostles so that they were together in the early hours of Easter Sunday. Before dawn Mary Magdalen and a few of the women set off for the tomb and found it empty. We can imagine her distress when she ran to tell the apostles of what she had found. St John in his gospel tells us how he and St Peter had run to the tomb. It was when they entered the tomb that the words of Jesus came back to them that the Lord had indeed risen from the dead. The resurrection is at the heart of our beliefs, that Jesus had suffered and died but was now risen from the dead. Years later St Paul, who never met Our Lord, became aware that if Christ has not been raised from the dead, his preaching was useless and so was the faith of those who listened to him or read his epistles.
